# FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

#### UPDATE REGARDING CHURCH CAPACITY

On April 8, 2021 the governor signed a health order that states: "Other than the Facial Coverings (Masks) requirements of this Order, the Social Distancing, Congregating and capacity requirements of the Order do not apply to religious observances."

While the dispensation from the Sunday obligation remains in place, Archbishop Schnurr is keenly aware of the pressure upon our parish communities relative to seating capacity. Maintaining the other protocols in accord with the orders of State of Ohio health authorities (i.e. masking) and the archdiocesan guidelines *Worship Together Safely*, **pastors may increase the potential capacity of church buildings, subject to any limitations by local health authorities (e.g. county board of health, city health department), which we have contacted and they have placed no special requirements for Miami County.** 

The Miami County has instructed that masks/ facial coverings must be worn.

Beginning on Monday, May 10, 2021, Transfiguration and St. Patrick parishes will be removing the ropes from most of the pews. We will be designating a section in each church for those individuals who wish to maintain physical distancing. St. Patrick's designated section will be the front half of the pews in front of the Sacred Heart Statue. That section will remain with the roped off pews. We will continue to clean and sanitize, and follow all other health recommendations. Distribution of Holy Communion will continue with the same pattern as we have been using throughout the past year.

#### NOVENA TO THE HOLY SPIRIT...

The Novena in honor of the Holy Spirit is the oldest of all Novenas, since it was first made at the direction of Our Lord Himself when He sent His apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Ghost on the first Pentecost. It is still the only Novena officially prescribed by the Church. Addressed to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the light and strength and love so sorely needed by every Christian. I am requesting that we pray this Novena for our families and our world.

# There will be a link on the website for the Novena, which consists of a different prayer for each day of the Novena. The Novena will begin on Saturday, May 15 and conclude on Pentecost Sunday, May 23rd.

To encourage devotion to the Holy Spirit, the Church has enriched this Novena with the following indulgences: Those who make a private Novena in honor of the Holy Spirit, either before the Solemn Feast of Pentecost or at any other time in the year, may also gain a partial indulgence for themselves or as an offering for the intentions of the faithful departed.

# **STAY THE COURSE**

Reflection on Mark 16:15-20

I must admit that I prefer the ending of Matthew's Gospel to how Mark ends his gospel today. In Matthew, we are given the Great Commission to go forth and make disciples of all nations, through baptizing and teaching. This is a good discipleship plan. Mark, on the other hand, mentions the signs that accompany believers; picking up snakes, drinking deadly poisons and picking fights with demons are not so much a part of my mission plan, my strategy for discipleship.

We live in this in-between time – after the ascension of Jesus and before He comes again – in divine empowerment for the Gospel dream. Through the power of the Holy Spirit poured into each of us, we are given the mission to face everything – good or ill – with the courage and faith of a believer, a disciple. These graces are continually renewed in us through the sacramental life of the Church, especially in the Eucharist.

The first and most important mandate/direction for us in defining our mission is to stay close to its source of energy and empowerment and allow the graces of the sacraments to always unfold in our lives. For without Christ, without the Holy Spirit, we can do nothing.

SAINT BERNARDINE OF SIENA Feast Day: May 20 • Patron Saint of Advertising and Communications

Most of the saints suffered great personal opposition, even persecution. Bernardine, by contrast, seems more like a human dynamo who simply took on the needs of the world.

He was the greatest preacher of his time, journeying across Italy, calming strife-torn cities, attacking the paganism he found rampant, attracting crowds of 30,000, following Saint Francis of Assisi's admonition to preach about "vice and virtue, punishment and glory."

At 22, he entered the Franciscan Order and was ordained two years later. For almost a dozen years he lived in solitude and prayer, but his gifts ultimately caused him to be sent to preach. He always traveled on foot, sometimes speaking for hours in one place, then doing the same in another town.

Especially known for his devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus, Bernardine devised a symbol—IHS, the first three letters of the name of Jesus in Greek – in Gothic letters on a blazing sun. This was to displace the superstitious symbols of the day, as well as the insignia of factions: for example, Guelphs and Ghibellines. The devotion spread, and the symbol began to appear in churches, homes and public buildings. Opposition arose from those who thought it a dangerous innovation. Three attempts were made to have the pope take action against him, but Bernardine's holiness, orthodoxy, and intelligence were evidence of his faithfulness.

General of the Friars of the Strict Observance, a branch of the Franciscan Order, Bernardine strongly emphasized scholarship and further study of theology and canon law. When he started there were 300 friars in the community; when he died there were 4,000. He returned to preaching the last two years of his life, dying while traveling.
