FR. ERIC – RAMBLINGS

IT STARTS AT HOME...

As we continue our journey into “getting more out of Mass,” we need to look at what we are doing at home to get ready for Mass. In last week’s bulletin article, we focused on our attitude in going to Mass; is it mere obligation or an action rooted in our *love* for the God who has loved us first and perfectly?

Thinking of the Eucharist as a celebration for which we are called for a “full and active” participation begins with knowing what we will be celebrating. As an example, let’s look at the game of Cricket. If both Fr. Michael and I sat down to watch the same match, let’s say England vs. India, he would be participating and enjoying the match way more than Fr. Eric, since Fr. Eric knows almost nothing about Cricket. Or if we’re going to an ethnic festival, we have a different interior sense, depending upon what we’re going to. If we’re going to an Irishfest celebration, and we’re Irish, all kinds of things will align our spirits with that celebration. We might tell our children some family stories and we will have memories to recount of past celebrations. Both examples, knowing the cultural and historical background of the celebration helps so much to enjoy the symbolism and take part in it more fully. The same is true for our celebration of Mass; the more we are familiar with the “culture” of what is happening at the Liturgy the more we can freely celebrate. The challenge for this week is to begin learning more about the Mass. This can be done by reading books on the Mass, or listening to podcasts or watching videos on Formed.

FEEDING A HUNGRY WORLD

Reflection on John 6:1-15

There is a story told about Mohandas Gandhi, a person who certainly knew the aching hearts of hungry millions. When asked once about Christ's followers and the meal that united them, he said: "I have finally figured out the meaning of the Eucharist. How else could God come to a hungry world except in food and drink?"

John's narrative of the feeding of the crowd is a foreshadowing of the gift of the Eucharist. We discover that with Jesus, hunger has a way of getting satisfied, because bread has a way of getting multiplied. We are hungry for so much – real and lasting peace, respect and dignity, good health, intimacy, the realization of ideals and dreams, and so much more.

At every Eucharist, we become more deeply the gift of the Real Presence of Jesus that we receive in the form of bread and wine. We are the gift to each other; we feed each other's hungers. We become like the boy who had the five barley loaves and two fish that day – we offer all that we have and all that we are to feed the crowd. Jesus takes us, blesses us, breaks us open, and distributes us. And God's love is multiplied!

SS. MARTHA, MARY AND LAZARUS

Feast Day: July 29 • Patron Saints of Siblings

Martha, Mary, and their brother Lazarus were evidently close friends of Jesus. He came to their home simply as a welcomed guest, rather than as one celebrating the conversion of a sinner like Zacchaeus or one unceremoniously received by a suspicious Pharisee. The sisters felt free to call on Jesus at their brother's death, even though a return to Judea at that time seemed to spell almost certain death.

Martha's great glory is her simple and strong statement of faith in Jesus after her brother's death. "Jesus told her, 'I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' She said to him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world.'" (John 11:25-27)

No doubt Martha was an active sort of person. On one occasion, she prepares the meal for Jesus and possibly His fellow guests and forthrightly states the obvious: All hands should pitch in to help with the dinner. The Lord recognizes that Martha is "worried about many things," also noting that Mary, who has spent the preparation time at Jesus' feet listening to His words "has chosen the better part." John 12:1-8 describes Mary's anointing of Jesus' feet at Bethany, an act which He praised highly.

Legends abound about the life of Lazarus after the death and Resurrection of Jesus. He is supposed to have left a written account of what he saw in the next world before he was called back to life. Some say he followed Peter into Syria. Another story is that despite being put into a leaking boat by the Jews at Jaffa, he, his sisters, and others landed safely in Cyprus. There he died peacefully after serving as bishop for 30 years.

In its 2021 decree on combining veneration of Mary and Lazarus with Martha, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments said, "In the household of Bethany, the Lord Jesus experienced the family spirit and friendship of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, and for this reason the Gospel of John states that He loved them. Martha generously offered Him hospitality, Mary listened attentively to His words and Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb at the command of the one who humiliated death."

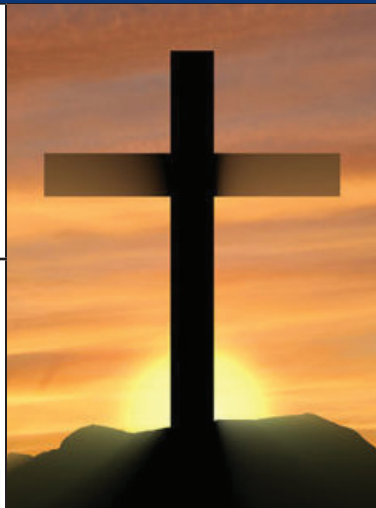
