FR. ERIC – RAMBLINGS

OBLIGATION: LAW AND LOVE

We do not go to Mass in order to give something to God but to receive what we truly need from Him. The Church's prayer, which is addressed to God, reminds us of this with the words: "Although you have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift, since our praises add nothing to your greatness but profit us for salvation." So, why do we go to Mass on Sunday? It is not enough to respond that it is a precept of the Church; this helps to preserve its value, but alone does not suffice. We Christians need to participate in Sunday Mass because only with Jesus' grace, with His living presence within us and among us, can we put His commandments into practice, and thus be His credible witnesses.



Principles

- We are obligated by Church law to participate in Mass on Sunday and holy days.
- We are also obligated to participate in Mass as a response to the love of God, shown and shared through Jesus Christ.
- The more deeply we grow in gratitude for the blessings of life, salvation, faith, gifts and resources, the more fully we will celebrate the Eucharist.
- Our participation in the Eucharist changes us.

DISTURBED BY GRACE

Reflection on Mark 6:1-6

I heard this so long ago that I can't remember who first said it: "The role of the prophet is to comfort the disturbed and to disturb the comfortable." This certain truth comes through in this weekend's readings.

God is sending his prophet Ezekiel to the Israelites who are, as God describes, "hard of face and obstinate of heart," and quite comfortably so! Stay tuned for how this "rebellious" house is disturbed by the prophet.

Jesus goes home, only to discover that "a prophet is not without honor except in his native place." How is it that these folks are so complacent in the sure comfort of "knowing" who Jesus is, and knowing to whom He is related? Their astonishment at the wisdom and mighty deeds of this hometown boy ultimately leads to them taking "offense at him." The dynamic of this transition, from astonishment to offense, may seem strange on the surface, until we consider how often we become fearful in life of any kind of change. As the townspeople go on about knowing His relatives, we hear them arguing from the familiar, the known, the comfortable. With Jesus, the status quo has been changed. Such disruption brings resentment and spells danger.

Perhaps this is why Jesus so often says, "Don't be afraid." He knows that the wisdom and mighty deeds He showers in each of our lives will change us and change the way we relate to each other. Unless we are too comfortable to be disturbed by grace.

ST. ELIZABETH OF PORTUGAL

Feast Day: July 4 • Patron Saint of Peacemakers

The daughter of King Pedro III, Elizabeth was named after her great-aunt, St. Elizabeth of Hungary. She had a very devout upbringing in thirteenth-century Spain and devoted herself to constant prayer and religious education. She married King Diniz when she was twelve and became queen of Portugal. She had two children, and later there was a terrible conflict between her son and his father, the king. The two went into battle against each other and Elizabeth took it upon herself to ride a horse onto the battlefield, get between them and make them resolve their differences without going to war. This act became the basis on which Elizabeth was named the patroness of peacemaking and invoked during wartime.

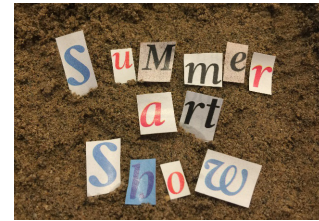
