WHAT COMES FROM WITHIN

Reflection on Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

If I thought much about it at all when I was a child, I probably would have said that I went to Sunday Mass because that is what we did as Catholics. There wasn't anything unusual about going to Mass as a family.

But here is my confession: In my first semester of college, I think I went to Mass only once. Perhaps that was typical for an 18-year-old on his own for the first time, beyond the reach of house rules. When home for Thanksgiving, however, house rules applied and I attended Mass with my family. I remember vividly realizing that weekend that this grounding, this gift of the Mass, was an experience that I missed terribly. The Mass centered me, and helped me remember who I was and what I was supposed to be about in the world.

We can approach our life of faith as a series of obligations and keep a close, calculating watch on our actions and those of others, making sure we, and they, are in conformity with all the laws, customs and traditions of our church. This seems to be what the scribes and Pharisees are about in today's Gospel, as they have a close eye on the actions of Jesus and His disciples.

Jesus is more interested in what comes "from within people, from their hearts." He lists a lot of evils that can come from within, and I suspect we are all too familiar with them. However, there are also many virtues that are enacted in our lives that also come from within. This is where we are beckoned to go.

ST. GREGORY THE GREAT

Feast Day: September 3 • Patron Saint of Students

Educated by the greatest and most knowledgeable teachers in Rome, Gregory was the son of a rich Roman senator and Silvia, who would later also become a saint. He grew up to be prefect of Rome and then, only a year later, sold all of his belongings and turned his house into a monastery. He built seven monasteries in Rome and Sicily and became a monk. When he witnessed children from England being sold in the Roman Forum, he became a missionary to England to put a stop to these horrific injustices. He was later elected pope and is also known as the initial collector of melodies and plainchant now known as Gregorian chants. The patron saint of students, Gregory's love for children and education was immeasurable.

St. Gregory the Great, father of the fathers I implore your prayers for all of the students who need guidance. Pray they make their studies a top priority And that their teachers are sound and committed. Ask God to let the knowledge flow readily to their hearts and minds And reward them for their sacrifice and dedication to their education. Through the Lord, Jesus Christ, I pray this solemn prayer. 

SO HAPPY TO BE BACK TO SCHOOL!

The staff started out the school year on August 16 attending an all day retreat to kick off *School of Faith*. The School of Faith is a faculty faith formation program that we participate in with the faculties from Piqua Catholic, Holy Angels and Lehman High School. On the Holy Family website, you will find the following statement about faculty faith formation:

The Vatican Congregation for Catholic Education recently published a guideline concerning formation of catholic school faculties entitled, Educating Together in Catholic Schools: A Shared Mission Between Consecrated Persons and the Lay Faithful. The guideline emphasized that "lay [teachers]... should have the opportunity of receiving the specific experiential knowledge of the mystery of Christ and of the Church that priests and religious automatically acquire in the course of their formation."

- Catechesis is a lifelong project, all the more so for those formally entrusted with the religious education of children.
- Most Catholic school educators have not had the advantage of the intensive spiritual and theological formation that religious brothers and sisters of past generations received.
- The challenge is to offer an ongoing "lay novitiate" for Catholic educators to arouse and deepen their own faith, with the consequence of better equipping them to foster the Catholic identity and mission of the school.

Our first retreat reminded us that Catholic education is more than just a curriculum. It is a pedagogy. Catholic education is a contemplative attitude that gazes and collects what it can from the beautiful things in this world. Catholic education educates the heart. In our heart is where Chirst resides. CCC 2563
