

#### SMALL GESTURE, BIG DIFFERENCE

Reflection on Mark 12:38-44

Sometimes, it may seem that what we are doing with our lives is not all that important. We may look at others who appear to be, well, important people – well-dressed, intelligent folk who are making great contributions to the world – and then look at our own lives and be tempted to think of them as rather insignificant.

The widow in this Gospel passage did not give very much, but Jesus praised her. Her small gesture of generosity came, not from her surplus, but from her substance. Small gestures, when done from the core of who we are, can make a decided difference in the larger scheme of things.

In Mark's Gospel, this passage is sandwiched between Jesus giving the Great Commandment (love God/love neighbor) and Jesus speaking about the end of times when each of us will have to give an accounting of our lives. Perhaps the account we should strive for is embodied best in this widow's gesture: making concrete the command of love by giving of all we are, all we have – our very substance, our very selves.

# SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI

Feast Day: November 13 • Patron Saint of Hospital Administrators and Immigrants

Frances Xavier Cabrini was the first United States citizen to be canonized. Her deep trust in the loving care of her God gave her the strength to be a valiant woman doing the work of Christ.

Refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher, she began charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy. In September 1877, she made her vows there and took the religious habit.



At the urging of Pope Leo XIII, Frances went west. She traveled with six sisters to New York City to work with the thousands of Italian immigrants living there.

She found disappointment and difficulties with every step. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. The archbishop advised her to return to Italy. But Frances, truly a valiant woman, departed from the archbishop's residence all the more determined to establish that orphanage. And she did.

In 35 years, Frances Xavier Cabrini founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. Seeing great need among Italian immigrants who were losing their faith, she organized schools and adult education classes.

The compassion and dedication of Mother Cabrini is still seen in hundreds of thousands of her fellow citizens who care for the sick in hospitals, nursing homes, and state institutions. We complain of increased medical costs in an affluent society, but the daily news shows us millions who have little or no medical care, and who are calling for new Mother Cabrinis to become citizen-servants of their land.



Beacons of Light is a multiyear process of pastoral planning for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Rooted in prayer, groupings of parishes will come together as one faith community. These new Families of Parishes

will be stronger together, focused more on mission than on maintenance. In the Families of Parishes, we will grow closer to God, follow Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit and radiate Christ in our lives.

There are six guiding principals

## FIRST GUIDING PRINCIPLE OF BEACONS OF LIGHT AND SAINTS WHO REPRESENT THE PRINCIPAL

1. Eucharist

"The Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life. Accordingly, the mass is essential moment for building up and strength the parish community along with the sacraments and other celebrations of paschal mystery- the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ (Beacons of Light)."

Saints: Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassti and Bl. Carlo Actuis

- Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati was born in Turin, Italy on April 6th, 1901. He was born to an affluent Italian family. Pier Giorgio joined the Marian Sodality and the Apostleship of Prayer when he was 12 years old. Pier Giorgio was given permission to receive daily communion, which was extremely rare at the time. From the beginning, Pier Giorgio showed a deep spirituality and missionary zeal. He placed the Holy Eucharist and Blessed Virgin at the center of his life. Pier Giorgio loved the outdoors and mountain climbing. He used his outings as a way to evangelize and lead his friends closer to Christ. "Pier Giorgio has a reputation for being "riotously funny" but in the chapel before the Lord he was intensely focused (frassatiusa.org). He would be seen spending frequent hours in Adoration often during the night. Pier Giorgio would spend the night in his mountain clothes before leaving early in the morning for a climbing excursion. His personal motto was Verso l'alto meaning 'toward the top.' Pier Giorgio died at the age of 24 after contracting polio. To learn more about Pier Giorgio's life visit frassatiusa.org.
- Bl. Carlo Acutis was born May 3rd, 1991, in London, England, but his family moved back to Italy soon after. He was a normal boy and loved things like football and Pokémon. However, his first love was our Lord in the Eucharist. By his own request, Carlo received his first communion at the age of 7. At the time, his parents were not religious, but Carlo was. Carlo was the ultimate reason his parents returned to the faith. "If we get in front of the Sun, we get sun tans, but when we get in front of Jesus in the Eucharist, we become saints." Carlo never missed daily Mass, even after he began traveling the world to visit Eucharistic miracles all over the world with his parents documenting them. Carlo was considered a "computer genius" by 14, he had created a Eucharistic Miracle display and a website. Carlo believed if people knew Jesus was truly in the Eucharist, they would turn to God. Carlo was a kind and humble soul. In early October 2006, Carlo was hospitalized for the flu, where it was discovered, he had cancer. He took the news calmly and immediately offered his suffering to the Pope. He passed away on October 12th, 2006.

#### **FAITH FORMATION**

## THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH (DECEMBER 8, 2020-DECEMBER 8, 2021)

In a new Apostolic Letter entitled <u>Patris corde</u> ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.

The Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To celebrate the anniversary, Pope Francis has proclaimed a special "Year of St Joseph," beginning on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021.

#### Conditions for the plenary indulgence

The plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions) to Christians who, with a spirit detached from any sin, participate in the Year of St. Joseph on these occasions and manners indicated by the Apostolic Penitentiary:

- 1. The plenary indulgence is granted to those who will meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer, or take part in a Spiritual Retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph.
- 2. The indulgence can also be obtained by those who, following St. Joseph's example, will perform a spiritual or corporal work of mercy.
- 3. The recitation of the Holy Rosary in families and among engaged couples is another way of obtaining indulgences.
- 4. Everyone who entrusts their daily activity to the protection of St. Joseph, and every faithful who invokes the intercession of St. Joseph so that those seeking work can find dignifying work can also obtain the plenary indulgence.
- 5. The plenary indulgence is also granted to the faithful who will recite the Litany to St. Joseph (for the Latin tradition), or the *Akathistos* to St. Joseph (for the Byzantine tradition), or any other prayer to St. Joseph proper to the other liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church *ad intra* and *ad extra*, and for the relief of all Christians suffering all forms of persecution.
- 6. In addition to these, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence to the faithful who will recite any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, for example, "To you, O blessed Joseph" especially on "19 March, on 1 May, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, on St. Joseph's Sunday (according to the Byzantine tradition) on the 19th of each month and every Wednesday, a day dedicated to the memory of the saint according to the Latin tradition."
- 7. Amid the ongoing Covid-19 health crisis, the gift of the plenary indulgence is also extended to the sick, the elderly, the dying and all those who for legitimate reasons are unable to leave their homes. They too can obtain the plenary indulgences if they are detached from any sin and have the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions and recite an act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, offering to God the pains and hardships of their lives.
