AROUND OUR PARISH**GIVE CATHOLIC....**

On Tuesday, November 30th, St. Patrick will be participating in the second annual "Give Catholic" program. *Give Catholic* is an opportunity for parishioners to make donations to their parish without being assessed by the archdiocese, or to put it another way, all money donated on Tuesday, November 30th will stay at St. Patrick. Last year, St. Patrick had the second highest amount donated, with over \$130, 000.00 collected. This year our goal is to raise funds to repair our church roof. We are currently getting estimates for the replacement/repair. This will be an expensive fix and we will be exploring our options but it is a high priority item since the leaking is continuing to cause plaster issues on the interior ceiling of the church. Repairing the interior plaster after the roof is replaced will be another matter. Please mark November 30th on your calendar and we will be providing more details on how to make your donation to our parish. Thank you so much for your generosity.

A SYNOD ON SYNODALITY?

Sounds strange, doesn't it? Yet this is what the Holy Father has called. In its simplest form, synodality represents a collaborative approach by all the people of God to address a particular issue for which the Holy Father seeks input. For this synod, he wants to hear from everyone on how the whole Church (not only the bishops and priests) can journey together in bringing the Gospel message to the world. To address this "synodal" approach, he has called for all dioceses in the world to hold local consultative meetings to discuss this topic. Currently, our archdiocese is targeting January and February of 2022 for these meetings. Please prayerfully consider participating in your local deanery meeting. That opportunity will **soon be available on our archdiocesan website.**

GOD'S KINGDOM COME

Reflection on Luke 21:25-28, 34, 36

Every season of Advent is an opportunity for us to learn more deeply how the past and the future comings of Jesus should impinge upon the present. We encounter Jesus, the One who was, who is, and who is to come.

Our Scripture readings for the Advent season reflect this reality. In the first readings, we are called to remember and make our own the past longings of our Hebrew ancestors. The second readings, from the letters of the early Christians, remind us of the present implications of our faith in Jesus. Each Advent Gospel reading summons us to welcome the future; not in fear and dread of the unknown, but with a sense of trust in the One Who Comes.

So today, the Gospel invites us to be vigilant, be attentive to God. Be watchful for His coming. Be open and malleable to the touch of God that will continuously shape us into His lovers. Be especially watchful for Christ's coming to us through our poor and most vulnerable brothers and sisters. Do we welcome Him in loving service?

SAINT JAMES OF THE MARCHE

Feast Day: November 28

Meet one of the fathers of the modern pawnshop!

James was born in the Marche of Ancona, in Central Italy along the Adriatic Sea. After earning doctorates in canon and civil law at the University of Perugia, he joined the Friars Minor and began a very austere life. He fasted nine months of the year; he slept three hours a night. Saint Bernardine of Siena told him to moderate his penances.

James studied theology with Saint John of Capistrano. Ordained in 1420, James began a preaching career that took him all over Italy and through 13 Central and Eastern European countries. This extremely popular preacher converted many people – 250,000 at one estimate – and helped spread devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. His sermons prompted numerous Catholics to reform their lives, and many men joined the Franciscans under his influence.

With John of Capistrano, Albert of Sarteano, and Bernardine of Siena, James is considered one of the “four pillars” of the Observant movement among the Franciscans. These friars became known especially for their preaching.

To combat extremely high interest rates, James established montes pietatis – literally, mountains of charity – nonprofit credit organizations that lent money on pawned objects at very low rates.

Not everyone was happy with the work James did. Twice assassins lost their nerve when they came face to face with him. James died in 1476, and was canonized in 1726.

James wanted the Word of God to take root in the hearts of his listeners. His preaching was directed to preparing the soil, so to speak, by removing any rocks and softening up lives hardened by sin. God's intention is that His word take root in our lives, but for that we need both prayerful preachers and cooperative listeners.

ANTIPHONS: A MISSING PUZZLE PIECE

Throughout the season of Advent, Mass is going to sound a little different. Instead of an opening hymn, the cantor or choir will chant an "Entrance Antiphon." And while you listen to these antiphons, you may wonder "What is an antiphon?"

Put simply, the antiphons are a set of musical prayers which have been assigned to each Mass, just like the readings on Sunday that are set to a predetermined schedule. Every Mass, not just those in Advent, has a set of assigned antiphons which are to be sung or read during the Entrance, Offertory, and Communion. *

You might also wonder, "Why are the antiphons important?" Antiphons are important because they are a lens through which we can view the Scriptures more richly. The antiphons are commonly drawn from the psalms and Old Testament, and make "comments" on the Gospel and readings of the day. They can highlight Old Testament prophecies that are brought to fruition in the life of Jesus, or comment with excitement on the events of the Gospels.

So, as we begin this Advent season, I encourage you to pray with the text of the antiphons, these "missing puzzle pieces" at Mass.

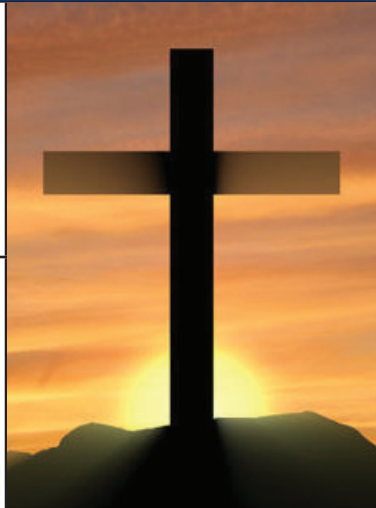
