FR. ERIC – RAMBLINGS

Fourth Sunday of Advent...

The following are the opening lyrics to a Casting Crowns (contemporary Christian group) song entitled, "While You Were Sleeping."

"O little town of Bethlehem, looks like another silent night. Above your deep and dreamless sleep a giant star lights up the sky. And while you're lying in the dark there shines an everlasting light, for the King has left His throne and is sleeping in a manger tonight. O Bethlehem, what you have missed while you were sleeping, for God became a man and stepped into your world today. O Bethlehem, you will go down in history as a city with no room for its King. While you were sleeping, while you were sleeping." Archbishop Fulton Sheen wrote, "Mary is now with child, awaiting birth, and Joseph is full of expectancy as he enters the city of his own family. He searched for a place for the birth of him to whom heaven and earth belonged. Could it be that the Creator would not find room in his own creation? Certainly, thought Joseph, there would be room in the village inn. There was room for the rich; there was room for those who were clothed in soft garments; there was room for everyone who had a tip to give to the innkeeper.

But when finally the scrolls of history are completed down to the last word of time, the saddest line of all will be: "There was no room in the inn." No room in the inn, but there was room in the stable. The inn was the gathering place of public opinion, the focal point of the world's moods, the rendezvous of the worldly, the rallying place of the popular and the successful. But there's no room in the place where the world gathers. The stable is a place for outcasts, the ignored and the forgotten. The world might have expected the Son of God to be born in an inn; a stable would certainly be the last place in the world where one would look for him. The lesson is: divinity is always where you least expect to find it. So the Son of God made Man is invited to enter into his own world through a back door."

On this final Sunday of Advent, as we near the final day of preparation for the celebration of the Birth of God, may we keep a watchful eye for the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, Emmanuel, God is with us.

GOD USES US TO BRING ABOUT HIS PURPOSE

Reflection on Luke Lk 1:39-45

The whole of our Scripture and Tradition reveal that God has shamelessly used people to accomplish His purposes for centuries. Today's readings give us two fine examples of God's use of a human being to reveal who God is and what God intends, in David and in Mary.

King David's noble intention is to build a house, but God uses the occasion for a far more lasting plan: to build a family, a people, through David and for Himself. This is the promise of an enduring kingdom, realized in the birth, life, suffering, death and Resurrection of Jesus, Son of the Father, Son of Mary, of the house and lineage of David. God's promise is accomplished through Mary. In her "Yes" to God's plan ("let it be done to me according to your Word"), Mary displays the radical openness and trust that God desires of each of us. For indeed, God desires to use each of us to bring about His purpose. In these remaining days before our Christmas celebration, let's pray for the same openness and trust that David and Mary, along with so many other saints through the ages, model for us.

BLESSED URBAN V

Feast Day: December 19

In 1362, the man elected pope declined the office. When the cardinals could not find another person among them for that important office, they turned to a relative stranger: the holy person we honor today.

The new Pope Urban V proved a wise choice. A Benedictine monk and canon lawyer, he was deeply spiritual and brilliant. He lived simply and modestly, which did not always earn him friends among clergymen who had become used to comfort and privilege. Still, he pressed for reform, and saw to the restoration of churches and monasteries. Except for a brief period, he spent most of his eight years as pope living away from Rome at Avignon, seat of the papacy from 1309, until shortly after his death.

Urban came close, but was not able to achieve one of his biggest goals – reuniting the Eastern and Western churches.

As pope, Urban continued to follow the Benedictine Rule. Shortly before his death in 1370, he asked to be moved from the papal palace to the nearby home of his brother, so he could say goodbye to the ordinary people he had so often helped.

Simplicity in the midst of power and grandeur seems to define this saint, as he reluctantly accepted the papacy, but remained at heart a Benedictine monk. Surroundings need not negatively influence a person.
