FR. MICHAEL'S VOICE

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT – GO, AND DO NOT SIN AGAIN:

A story is told of a group of tourists who were visiting a large sheep farm. The guide of the tourists was explaining how the little lambs are taken care of by the mother sheep. In order to demonstrate this, he took one little lamb from the farm and placed it in a large enclosure with thousands of sheep. The noise of the bleating sheep was deafening. The little lamb, who seemed lost in the midst of that crowd, after a moment of silence, began crying loudly. As it bleated, the mother sheep, who was at the end of the enclosure, heard the cry and rushed towards her little lamb. As the tourists were wonder-struck at this sight, the guide – who was a Christian – made a statement: “This is how it is with God also! We should never imagine that we are beyond the reach of God! God’s grace enables us to confront our sin for what it is – unfaithfulness to God, and to turn back to God with a repentant heart and a thankful spirit for God’s mercy and forgiveness. Do you know the joy of repentance and a clean conscience?”

**YOUR CONFESSIONS MADE ME GROW IN HOLINESS AND HELPED ME TO BE FAITHFUL TO MY VOCATION:**

One of the best spiritual practices is going to make Confessions. Here in both parishes, I heard countless sincere Confessions, which demanded me to be more Holy and be a simple person and Holy priest. Fr. Eric had realized and added more time for Confession at St Patrick Church: Tuesdays’ one-hour Adoration and Confessions and daily morning Rosary and Confessions. I believe in the coming years, you will continue to grow in spirituality and continue the hours of Confession and Adoration.

ST. PATRICK’S FEAST: It was the first year, I heard people talking about St. Patrick’s Feast Day. I was expecting it is going to be a big and grand celebration. Later in the evening, there were a lot of people with Irish pants, a green color dress code and registration, getting green colored glasses... Thanks be to God, St. Patrick is not a much-known saint in India.

THROWING STONES

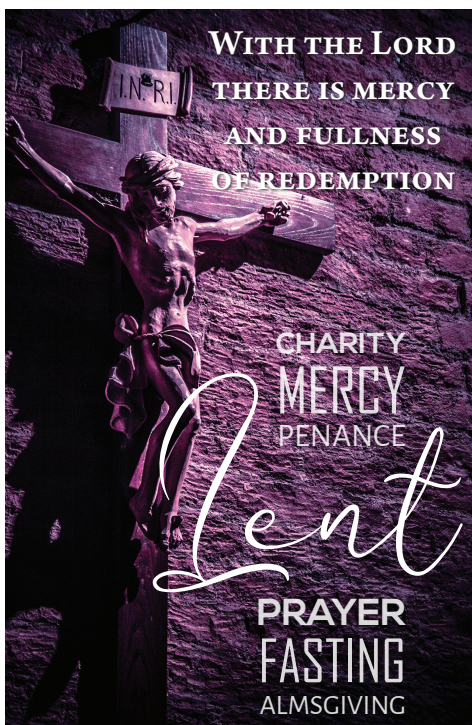
Reflection on John 8:1-11

Last Sunday, in the story of the Prodigal Son, we were given that compelling image of the long road with two figures at either end, and saw how that image assured us that our God is always looking for us, waiting to embrace us in love and forgiveness. And we also saw how that image challenged us to make the journey to God, and at times, to ourselves be the reconciler, ready to embrace and forgive others. In today's familiar story, Jesus gives us a clear example of this road to reconciliation.

We don't know for sure what Jesus wrote on the ground, but that little detail certainly adds a bit of suspense to the story. It was Jesus' spoken word that caught everyone unaware: "Let the one among you who is without sin cast the first stone." With this Word, Jesus had them, and He has us, over a barrel.

It is so easy, and so prevalent, especially through social media posts, to identify and vilify that person whom we judge to be standing in shame among us because of some behavior or action. Next time you may want to post a comment in judgment about someone in particular, recall this Gospel story, and think of your comment as a stone that you are throwing.

Patron Saint of Tutors and Teachers

Also known as the father of modern education, John's experience with and devotion to teaching young minds was exemplary. He was born in Reims, France in 1651 and went on to attend the seminary in Paris. Unfortunately, he was forced to leave and take care of his younger siblings after the death of their parents. When they were grown, John went back to school and completed his education and was ordained. He established the first teachers' school and began the process of dividing children into various grade levels. John also founded various types of schools, such as trade schools and secondary schools. He was proclaimed the patron saint of tutors and teachers by the pope in 1950.
