FR. MICHAEL'S VOICE

UNLESS YOU REPENT, YOU WILL PERISH: What causes suffering or affliction, and what does God want to teach us through it? The people of Israel suffered greatly under the oppressive rule of Egypt for more than 400 years. Did they suffer unjustly, or was God angry with them? God was faithful to His people, Israel, even in the midst of their affliction and ill-treatment by their Egyptian taskmasters. Throughout their long history of exile and suffering, God made them strong and they grew in numbers. God listened to their plea for mercy and freedom. God raised up a saviour for them, called Moses, whom He taught and tested in the wilderness until he was ready to hear and obey God's call.

BEACONS OF LIGHT UPDATE

With the recent announcements of the priest assignments, I have had several individuals ask “What is the next step in the *Beacons of Light*?” Each Family of Parishes will follow the Pastoral Planning Pathway to guide its future. This Pathway will assist each Family of Parishes in creating a pastoral plan for the parishes in each Family, articulating how they will live out the six Beacons principles and abide by each of the parameters, all aimed towards vital, mission-driven, parish life within the Family of Parishes, and ultimately, as one canonical parish. Phase 1 of the planning will begin in all parishes in July, 2022. In the meantime, we are in Phase 0, which is an opportunity for parish leaders to spend time in prayer, in learning about the parishes, and preparing for the important work of pastoral planning. Please continue to pray.

DIVINELY CARED FOR

Reflection on Luke 13:1-9

Oppression, suffering, fatal accidents, all make an appearance in this Gospel story. While these human experiences seem so random and are frightening to us, we have the assurance of Jesus that God does not use them as punishment for sin, nor are our lives devoid of God's enduring providence. Rather, through His own suffering and death, Jesus has made it eternally clear that He is never closer to us than in these times of trial.

We are that fig tree that is being cultivated, fertilized, divinely cared for so that we will bear fruit. By shifting the conversation from the disciples wondering if these victims brought these tragedies upon themselves by their sin and disobedience, to considering what a short time they themselves have for repenting and bearing fruit, Jesus cuts to the heart of the truth that the Kingdom, God's rule, is here and now.

When Jesus spoke of God's providence, He did not do so in tragic terms—lightning bolts and punishments—but rather he spoke of God artistically, clothing lilies, or functionally feeding sparrows, or lazily counting every hair on each human head! That is real, personal, loving involvement with the world, with us.

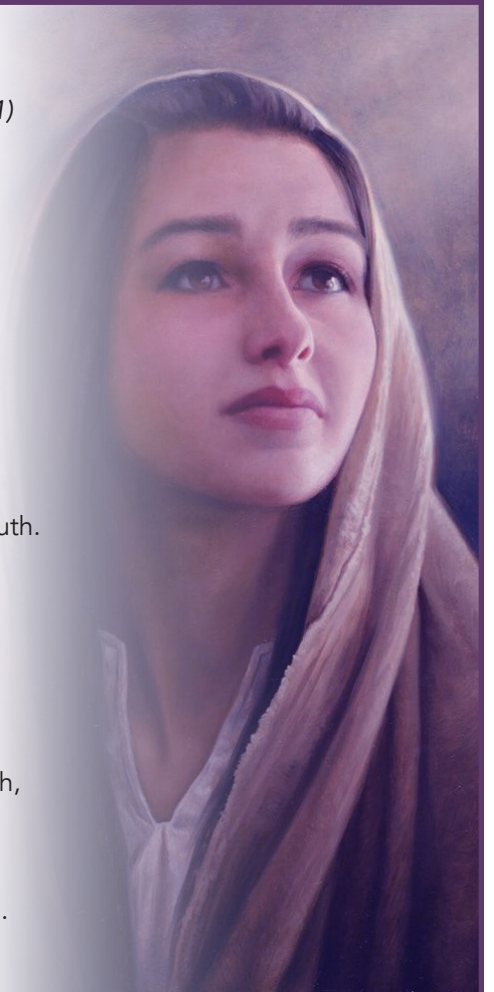

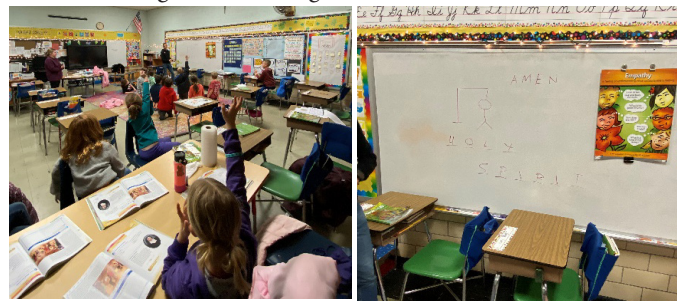
