FR. MICHAEL'S VOICE

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT - I WILL GO HOME TO MY FATHER:

What's worse than being separated from your home, loved ones and friends? The pain of separation can only be surpassed by the joy of the homecoming and reunion. God's mercy and kindness knows no bounds. In this parable, Jesus gives a vivid picture of God and what God is like. God is truly kinder than any of us. He does not lose hope



or give up when we stray from Him. He is always on the lookout for those who have a change of heart and want to return. He rejoices in finding the lost and in welcoming them home. Do you know the joy of repentance and the restoration of your relationship as a son or daughter of your heavenly Father?

PICKLEBALL AND MY AMERICAN FRIENDS: It was summer. I was searching for some sports to play. Bill Platfoot asked, "Do you want to play 'Pickleball'?" "What, 'Pickleball'?" "Yes!" WE HAVE BEEN FOUND

Reflection on Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

I have heard so many variations of this prodigal son/prodigal daughter story through the years, as individuals have shared how they have wandered away from God and what happened to spark their homecoming, their return. It is truly a universal story to which all of us can relate. I laughed out loud recently when a speaker at a conference related that a child wasting his/her parents' money on loose living is, in contemporary terms, called college.

However any of us may have wandered off, gone astray, wasted our inheritance, misused our gifts, wallowed in sin, the Good News is not just that we can repent and return, but that our Loving Father is actively searching for us, scanning the horizon, ready for the celebration that must take place when reconciliation occurs. "But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found." I cannot read or proclaim these Gospel words without being overcome with emotion, knowing how much my Father has forgiven me.

SAINT FRANCIS OF PAOLA

Feast Day: April 2 Patron Saint of Sailors

Francis of Paola was a man who deeply loved contemplative solitude and wished only to be the "least in the household of God." Yet, when the Church called him to active service in the world, he became a miracle-worker and influenced the course of nations.

After accompanying his parents on a pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi, he began to live as a contemplative hermit in a remote cave near Paola, on Italy's southern seacoast. Before he was 20, he received the first followers who had come to imitate his way of life. Seventeen years later, when his disciples had grown in number, Francis established a Rule for his austere community and sought Church approval. This was the founding of the Hermits of St. Francis of Assisi, who were approved by the Holy See in 1474.

It was Francis's desire to be a contemplative hermit, yet he believed that God was calling him to the apostolic life. He began to use the gifts he had received, such as the gifts of miracles and prophecy, to minister to the people of God. A defender of the poor and oppressed, Francis incurred the wrath of King Ferdinand of Naples for the admonitions he directed toward the king and his sons.

Following the request of Pope Sixtus IV, Francis traveled to Paris to help Louis XI of France prepare for his death. While ministering to the king, Francis was able to influence the course of national politics. Francis died while at the French court.

The life of Francis of Paola speaks plainly to an overactive world. He was a contemplative man called to active ministry and must have felt keenly the tension between prayer and service. Yet, in Francis's life it was a productive tension, for he clearly utilized the fruits of contemplation in his ministry, which came to involve the workings of nations. He responded so readily and so well to the call of the Church from a solid foundation in prayer and mortification. When he went out to the world, it was not he who worked but Christ working through him.
