FR. MICHAEL'S VOICE

BLESSED IS THE KING WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD:

Augustine, the great 5th-century church father, comments on the significance of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem: "The master of humility is Christ who humbled Himself and became obedient even to death, even the death of the cross. Thus, He does not lose His divinity when He teaches us humility... What great thing was it to the king of the ages to become the king of humanity?"

**TORNADO, MAY 27TH, 2019:**

Around 5:00 p.m., there was a siren warning, and I went to my basement and saw all the electrical wires hanging. I was frightened about electrical shocks. Once again, at 6:00 p.m., a warning was given, but I did not realize how serious it could be. Later, at 10:45 p.m., then again at 11:00 p.m., tornado warnings were given, but I was not willing to get up from my bed and slept. The next day, as I was going to Transfiguration for noon Mass, I witnessed roads blocked and huge trees on the ground and Lange Estate was closed. Oh, it was my first experience to witness a tornado, and how dangerous! No priests were hurt. The following week, many strong volunteers came with their chainsaws and cut huge trees and cleaned in a single day.

BLESSED AMONG THE WISE:

Who are these "Blessed among the Wise?" They are our retired priests at Lange Estate. Yes, they have such great experiences, and even after being Priests for a long time, still, they are very simple and humble – especially the way they welcomed me on Tuesdays for evening dinners! They always invited me and put out a few questions, and listened and appreciated and encouraged me a lot. I really miss the Late Fr. Bill Myers, Fr. Brinkmoeller and Fr. Tom Smith, I believe they are in Heaven and praying for me.

Please join us for a special reception for Fr. Michael on April 24, following all Sunday Masses. He will be going home to India in May.

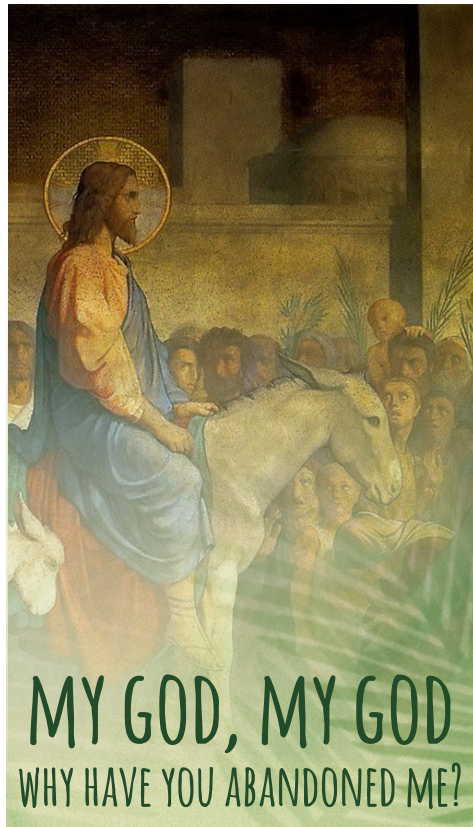
Reflection on Luke 22:14–23:56

Palm Sunday always invites us to enter the holiest week of the year by hearing the entire Passion story of Jesus, a story that we will hear and celebrate in its essential parts from Holy Thursday through Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday. We are invited to enter into the story ourselves, to allow the story of Jesus' suffering, death and Resurrection to interpret our lives.

We are not viewing a movie – one more bathrobe, Bible-drama in Hollywood's cinematic library. We are hearing and telling our story: the Passion of Christ as it continues to be lived out today. We are not just remembering historical events, but committing ourselves to follow the same path as the Lord Jesus. For this path – the Paschal Mystery, the mystery of dying and rising – is the central reality of the life of every follower of Jesus.

We are all pilgrims on the same road, and our individual stories now merge with the story of Jesus this week as we walk with the same faith toward the same destination. And how good it is for us to be in community, for who, like Jesus, could walk this road alone?

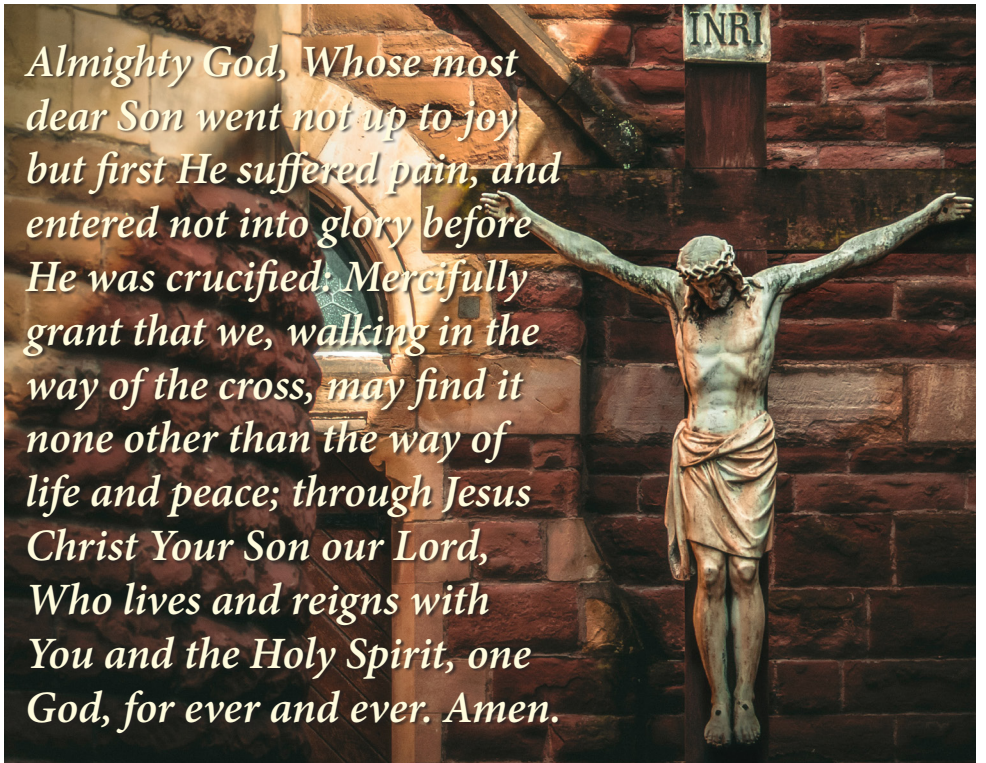
