FR. MICHAEL'S VOICE

UNLESS I SEE – I WILL NOT BELIEVE: *Touching the Flesh, He Invokes the Word*, by Augustine of Hippo, 354-430 A.D. “But when Jesus showed Thomas the very places where he had his doubts, Thomas exclaimed, ‘My Lord and my God.’ He touched his flesh, he proclaimed his divinity. What did he touch? The body of Christ. Was the body of Christ the divinity of Christ? The divinity of Christ was the Word; the humanity of Christ was soul and flesh. Thomas could not touch the soul, but he could perceive it because the body that had been dead was moving about alive. But that Word is subject neither to change nor to contact, it neither regresses nor progresses, neither fails nor flourishes, because *in the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God*. That is what Thomas proclaimed. He touched the flesh, he invoked the Word, because *the Word became flesh and dwelt among us*.” (Excerpt from *Sermon 145A*)

Since we [E. & M.] switch our schedule alternative weeks between Troy and West Milton, it was not possible. Adults and schoolchildren did ask me, “Last Sunday, I did not see you in the church. Where were you? I hope you are in good health?” A few children said, “You missed Sunday Mass?” I know what they meant [Sunday is a day of obligation]. I was able to do justice to my stay in this Region – 6. I did not make any decision, I just did what was asked by Eric. I thank Fr. Eric for his understanding and for giving me the freedom to do the work. Special thanks to Fr. Joe SM; he is imitating St. Joseph too much and is a very soft and sweet Marianist. Special thanks to D.J. (Deacon John).

INTO THE WOUNDS

Reflection on John 20:19-31

I don't remember who said this, but it rings so true: "Christianity has nothing to say to someone who does not know himself/herself to be a sinner. If I know not my deep need for forgiveness and redemption, then divine mercy makes no sense; it is lost on me."

How blessed and grateful we are, though, when this great gift of divine mercy is accepted and flows into our hearts and lives! I am convinced that when we receive God's mercy, in a proper disposition of repentance, then God does not want us to be burdened with the sins that have shamed us and brought us low. Instead, God desires us to be truly free, for His gift of mercy liberates us to be merciful.

In today's Gospel, Jesus invites Thomas into His wounds, and so into the reception of His divine life. So is this pattern enacted for us, as well. It is going deeply into our wounds that sin has caused, where we are in contact with the wounds of Christ that redeem us. Praise God for His great mercy!

SAINT MARK

Feast Day: April 25

Patron Saint of Notaries and Venice

Most of what we know about Mark comes directly from the New Testament. He is usually identified with the Mark of Acts 12:12. When Saint Peter escaped from prison, he went to the home of Mark's mother. Paul and Barnabas took him along on the first missionary journey.

The oldest and the shortest of the four Gospels, the Gospel of Mark emphasizes Jesus' rejection by humanity while being God's triumphant envoy. Probably written for gentile converts in Rome – after the death of Peter and Paul sometime between A.D. 60 and 70 – Mark's Gospel is the gradual manifestation of a "scandal": a crucified Messiah.

Like another Gospel writer Luke, Mark was not one of the 12 apostles. We cannot be certain whether he knew Jesus personally. Some scholars feel that the evangelist is speaking of himself when describing the arrest of Jesus in Gethsemane: "Now a young man followed him wearing nothing but a linen cloth about his body. They seized him, but he left the cloth behind and ran off naked" (Mark 14:51-52).

Others hold Mark to be the first bishop of Alexandria, Egypt. Venice, famous for the Piazza San Marco, claims Mark as its patron saint; the large basilica there is believed to contain his remains.

A winged lion is Mark's symbol. The lion derives from Mark's description of John the Baptist as a "voice of one crying out in the desert" (Mark 1:3), which artists compared to a roaring lion. The wings come from the application of Ezekiel's vision of four winged creatures to the evangelists.

Mark fulfilled in his life what every Christian is called to do: proclaim to all people the Good News that is the source of salvation. In particular, Mark's way was by writing. Others may proclaim the Good News by music, drama, poetry, or by teaching children around a family table.
