CONGRATULATIONS, DEACON JEFF STEPHENS

On Saturday, April 23, 2022, our seminarian Jeff was ordained as a deacon. It was a beautiful Liturgy, in which I was honored to participate as one of Jeff's vesters. The man to be ordained (deacon and/or priest) chooses two ordained ministers to assist him in putting on his vestments



for the first time. God willing, in one year (May, 2023) Jeff will be ordained a priest for our Archdiocese. In the meantime, over the next year, the roles of the deacon are at the Mass. The deacon proclaims the Gospel, may be invited to preach the homily, and assists at the altar. The deacon may also baptize, witness and bless marriages, preside at the Liturgy of the Hours, and preside at funeral liturgies, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament among many other duties. I ask that you continue to keep Deacon Jeff in your prayers as he prepares for his final year of formation before being ordained a priest.

FR. MICHAEL'S VOICE

"DO YOU LOVE ME MORE THAN THESE?"

Why didn't the apostles immediately recognize the Risen Lord Jesus when He greeted them at the Sea of Tiberias (also called the Lake of Gennesaret or Galilee)? John gives us a clue. He states that Peter had decided to return to his home district of Galilee, very likely so he could resume his fishing career. Peter was discouraged and didn't know what to do after the tragedy of Jesus' death! He went back to his previous job as a fisherman out of uncertainty about his future. Six of the other apostles followed him back to Galilee. When Jesus asked Peter, "Do you love me more than these?" He may have pointed to the boats, nets, and other fishing companions. He may have challenged Peter to let go of his career as a fisherman for the task of shepherding the people whom Christ would call to be His disciples. Jesus may have also pointed to the other apostles and to Peter's previous boast: "Though they all fall away because of you, I will never fall away" (Matthew 26:33). Peter now makes no boast or comparison, but humbly responds: "You know I love you."

**THE PAST FIVE YEARS: "MY PEOPLE"**

The past five years, I was far away from India and was with you. Now, going back to my country, I am going too far away from you. It is very painful for me. I have experienced your love and friendship and have also learned to call everyone "FRIENDS." These FIVE YEARS are going to make me call you "MY PEOPLE IN US." There are a few times I said, "MY People," i.e., people of India. Someone asked me, "What about us? Are we not your people?" YES.

RECONCILIATION

Reflection on John 21:1-19

John's Gospel mentions "a charcoal fire" only two times. The first is when Peter was warming himself by a charcoal fire when he denied knowing Jesus. The second time is in this remarkable story often called "breakfast on the beach," where Jesus has a charcoal fire going near the shore after this extraordinary fishing expedition. This time, the fire is the setting not for denial, but for reconciliation.

Notice that the art, the ritual, of reconciliation for Jesus has less to do with guilt, sin and the past, than with forgiveness, grace and the future. Not once does Jesus mention Peter's failings, nor does He make mention of the past. Instead, He invites and allows Peter, though it is painful and through tears, to express his love for Jesus. In asking Peter three times if he loves Him, Jesus looks to the future by entrusting Peter with His mission. Reconciliation for Jesus, in this story as in so many others, is not about guilt or blame, but is an opportunity for forgiveness and transformation.

When we can say, with Peter, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you," we can both acknowledge our weakness and claim our source of strength.

SAINT ATHANASIUS

Feast Day: May 2

Patron Saint of Theologians

Born of a Christian family in Alexandria, Egypt, and given a classical education, Athanasius became secretary to Alexander, the bishop of Alexandria, entered the priesthood and was eventually named bishop himself. His predecessor, Alexander, had been an outspoken critic of a new movement growing in the East – Arianism.

When Athanasius assumed his role as bishop of Alexandria, he continued the fight against Arianism. At first, it seemed that the battle would be easily won and that Arianism would be condemned. Such, however, did not prove to be the case. The Council of Tyre was called and for several reasons that are still unclear, the Emperor Constantine exiled Athanasius to northern Gaul. This was to be the first in a series of travels and exiles reminiscent of the life of Saint Paul.

After Constantine died, his son restored Athanasius as bishop. This lasted only a year, however, for he was deposed once again by a coalition of Arian bishops. Athanasius took his case to Rome, and Pope Julius I called a synod to review the case and other related matters.

Five times Athanasius was exiled for his defense of the doctrine of Christ's divinity. During one period of his life, he enjoyed 10 years of relative peace – reading, writing, and promoting the Christian life along the lines of the monastic ideal to which he was greatly devoted. His dogmatic and historical writings are almost all polemic, directed against every aspect of Arianism.

Athanasius suffered many trials while he was bishop of Alexandria. He was given the grace to remain strong against what probably seemed at times to be insurmountable opposition. Athanasius lived his office as bishop completely. He defended the true faith for his flock, regardless of the cost to himself. In today's world, we are experiencing this same call to remain true to our faith, no matter what.
