FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

THE RETURN OF THE PRECIOUS CHALICE TO MASS

With the return of the Precious Chalice to Mass, I would like to share with you a small portion of a letter from the archbishop to his priests regarding the practice of intinction. Intinction is the practice of "dipping the host in the chalice." The following is a portion from the letter explaining that this practice should not take place in our archdiocese.



"The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that the diocesan bishop may establish norms for the distribution of Holy Communion under both kinds (the bread and the wine). *This Holy and Living Sacrifice* states clearly: 'While intinction by a minister (bishop, priest, deacon; not lay) is permitted, it is not the preferred form of distribution of Holy Communion in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.' Therefore, I discourage the practice of intinction in parishes in the archdiocese."

In light of this statement from the archbishop, the parishes of St. Patrick and Transfiguration will NOT be offering intinction as a form of receiving Holy Communion.

BEAUTIFUL AS A BRIDE

Reflection on Revelation 21:1-5a

John gives us as good a vision of eternity as any we're likely to get: a Holy city, the New Jerusalem, as beautiful as a bride on her wedding day; a city where God dwells forever with humanity, where all the old order of death, tears, pain and crying out is wiped away, and where all things are made new. It is a vision of what God is up to in and through us!

Jesus said we are to love one another the way He loved us, and still loves us: selflessly, sacrificially, with mercy. This is what God is up to in us, making all things new. In this task, we are not called to perfection, but we are called to faithfulness. And to remember that we are never called to something without also being equipped to carry it out.




