## GIFT OF PEACE

Reflection on John 14:23-29

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." What is this peace that Jesus gives?

In order to receive Jesus' gift of peace, we must be rooted in the conviction that His death and Resurrection has freed us from all fear and death, and opened for us a hope for eternal life. When we truly know and believe that, as St. Paul says, "nothing can separate us from the love of Christ," then we are disposed to receive the gift of peace. For what can the world offer in the way of peace, but some vague and passing sense of inner calm and perhaps outer harmony, that will come to us from time to time, but flee at the first hint of fear or distress. This is why Jesus follows His promise of peace with, "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid..." When the love that conquers death inhabits our hearts, fear is banished, and the greatest of all fears – the fear of death itself – is transformed into hope in the One who has loved us into life and who nourishes us at every moment throughout life. Peace rises in us, and replaces fear.

Saint Padre Pio reminds us: "Peace is the simplicity of spirit, the serenity of conscience, the tranquility of soul and the bond of love. Peace... is the continual joy that is born... in always trusting in Divine Mercy."

## SAINT AUGUSTINE OF CANTERBURY

Feast Day: May 27

Patron Saint of England

In the year 596, some 40 monks set out from Rome to evangelize the Anglo-Saxons in England. Leading the group was Augustine, the prior of their monastery. Hardly had he and his men reached Gaul when they heard stories of the ferocity of the Anglo-Saxons and of the treacherous waters of the English Channel. Augustine returned to Rome and to Gregory the Great – the pope who had sent them – only to be assured by him that their fears were groundless.

Augustine set out again. This time the group crossed the English Channel and landed in the territory of Kent, ruled by King Ethelbert, a pagan married to a Christian, Bertha. Ethelbert received them kindly, set up a residence for them in Canterbury and within the year, on Pentecost Sunday 597, was himself baptized. He constructed a church and monastery near where the present cathedral, begun in 1070, now stands. As the faith spread, additional sees were established at London and Rochester.

Laboring patiently, Augustine wisely heeded the missionary principles suggested by Pope Gregory: purify rather than destroy pagan temples and customs; let pagan rites and festivals be transformed into Christian feasts; retain local customs as far as possible. The limited success Augustine achieved in England before his death in 605, would eventually bear fruit long after in the conversion of England. Augustine of Canterbury can truly be called the "Apostle of England."

Augustine of Canterbury comes across today as one who could suffer like many of us from a failure of nerve. For example, his first venture to England ended in a big U-turn back to Rome. He made mistakes and met failure in his peacemaking attempts with the Briton Christians. He often wrote to Rome for decisions on matters he could have decided on his own had he been more self-assured. Augustine's perseverance amidst obstacles and only partial success teaches today's apostles and pioneers to struggle on despite frustrations and be satisfied with gradual advances.
