FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

A HUGE THANK-YOU TO FR. MICHAEL...

Over the past several weeks, I have thoroughly enjoyed reading Fr. Michael's bulletin articles. It is clear from the memories that he has shared what a HUGE impact he has had on our communities, but also, the HUGE impact we have had on his life.



From the first Skype call with Bishop Binzer, Fr. Michael, and myself, it was clear that Fr. Michael lived a life full of joy and love for the Lord, and the past five years has only confirmed his deep love for the Lord and his priestly vocation. When I think back over the past five years, my fondest memories of Fr. Michael are seeing him sitting in a dark church with his rosary in his hand, praying. He has challenged me; not by words, but by his actions, to be a better priest and for that, I am so very thankful.

Fr. Michael, thank you so much for your wonderful priestly witness, which you lived out each day in your love and care for the people of God. Thank you for a beautiful example of living the Great Commandment, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

THE RETURN OF THE PRECIOUS CHALICE TO MASS

With the return of the Precious Chalice to Mass, I would like to share with you a small portion of a letter from the archbishop to his priests regarding the practice of intinction. Intinction is the practice of "dipping the host in the chalice." The following is a portion from the letter explaining that this practice should not take place in our Archdiocese.

"The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that the diocesan bishop may establish norms for the distribution of Holy Communion under both kinds (the bread and the wine). *This Holy and Living Sacrifice* states clearly: "While intinction by a minister (bishop, priest, deacon, not lay) is permitted, it is not the preferred form of distribution of Holy Communion in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati." Therefore, I discourage the practice of intinction in parishes in the archdiocese."

In light of this statement from the archbishop, the parishes of St. Patrick and Transfiguration will NOT be offering intinction as a form of receiving Holy Communion.

FR. MICHAEL'S VOICE

Let us love our God and His church from where we can always hear His voice. Secondly, let us love and serve our families where you understand and experience His voice; then, finally, always pray for your priests, that they may continue to be His voice.



MY NEW ASSIGNMENT IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HYDERABAD, INDIA:

My new assignment in India is going to be Parish Priest, Maria Rani Church, [New quasi-Parish], Mariapuram, Hyderabad, Telangana state. Forty Catholic families are living under this parish, and the diocese believes there are a lot of scope for a good future parish. My diocese wishes and believes I can join with the people, build a new parish community, and build a new church by raising funds.

How far is your family from this parish? I am working in my neighboring state Telangana. It is around 394 miles away from my native village going to work. I always visit two times in a single year. My home address is A. Kattupadi Post, Vellore, Tamil Nādu, 623011. My new assignment Parish address is Maria Rani Church, Mariapuram, Hyderabad, Telangana State. The distance is 394 miles. By bus or train, it will take 14 to 15 hours.

My request: Remember and pray for me, that I must continue to try hard to become a holy and faithful priest and serve God and His people with humility. Try this; just Google the translation in my mother tongue, **Tamil:**

Finally, pray for my safe travel home. Thank you very much. Let us remain in Christ's love.

SAINT DAMIEN DE VEUSTER OF MOLOKA'I

Feast Day: May 10

Jn 10:22-30

Patron Saint of People with Leprosy

When Joseph de Veuster was born in Tremelo, Belgium, in 1840, few people in Europe had any firsthand knowledge of leprosy, Hansen's disease. By the time he died at the age of 49, people all over the world knew about this disease because of him. They knew that human compassion could soften the ravages of this disease.

Forced to quit school at age 13 to work on the family farm, Joseph entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary six years later, taking the name of a fourth-century physician and martyr. When his brother Pamphile, a priest in the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to the Hawaiian Islands as assigned, Damien quickly volunteered in his place. In May 1864, two months after arriving in his new mission, Damien was ordained a priest in Honolulu and assigned to the island of Hawaii.

In 1873, he went to the Hawaiian government's leper colony on the island of Moloka'i, set up seven years earlier. Part of a team of four chaplains taking that assignment for three months each year, Damien soon volunteered to remain permanently, caring for the people's physical, medical, and spiritual needs. In time, he became their most effective advocate to obtain promised government support. Soon the settlement had new houses and a new church, school and orphanage. Morale improved considerably. A few years later, he succeeded in getting the Franciscan Sisters of Syracuse, led by Mother Marianne Cope, to help staff this colony in Kalaupapa.

Damien contracted Hansen's disease and died of its complications. When Hawaii became a state in 1959, it selected Damien as one of its two representatives in the Statuary Hall at the US Capitol. Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 11, 2009.


