### FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

### THE FIREWORKS OF THE 4TH OF JULY CELEBRATIONS...

I recently had the wonderful opportunity to be the spiritual director for a pilgrimage of about 25 people that began in Lisbon, Portugal and ended in Paris, France. Along the way, we took in Fatima, parts of Spain, Lourdes and Lisieux, which is in the Normandy area of France. On our second to the last day, we spent the afternoon at Omaha Beach in Normandy



at the American Cemetery. As a veteran of the United States Army, it was incredibly emotional and moving to see the crosses and Jewish stars marking the graves of so many Americans who laid down their lives for freedom. As I spent time on the beach and in the water of Normandy, I flashed back to my time in the US Army – in particular, basic training and the constant voice of the drill sergeants shaping all of us into soldiers who, like so many before, would be willing to lay down their lives to save the life of another, to sacrifice for freedom. A wonderful visual of this is in the first *Captain America* movie, when little Steve Rogers throws himself on a grenade. It was fake, but he didn't know that, he just knew he needed to sacrifice himself to save his comrades. It brings to mind the line from Sacred Scripture: "no greater love is there than this, to lay down your life for a friend." In our spiritual journey to eternal union with God, I pray that each of us carries in his heart this principle of "sacrificing for another." The great commandment (the Shema Prayer of the Old Testament) calls us to love God with all of our being and to love our neighbor. We are called to love our neighbor as Christ loves us.


### FOURTH OF JULY

Reflection on Luke 10:1-12, 17-20


Luke's account of the commissioning and sending of His disciples offers us some significant mission tips we might do well to consider.

The seventy-two are sent out "in pairs." There is community in mission; we are not lone rangers. This evokes Paul's image of the Body of Christ, a community of many, each differently gifted. We have need of each other in mission.

"I am sending you like lambs among wolves," Jesus says. While this image may be a certain challenge to the more timid among us, it nonetheless grounds us in the reality that we must expect some push-back to the message. When that rejection comes - in the manner of a town you enter that won't receive you – don't make a nuisance of yourself. Simply proclaim the Kingdom, shake it off, and move on. After all, our task is to plant the seeds; God will nourish them for arowth.

There is great rejoicing in mission, not because of anything you and I have accomplished, and certainly not because of any powerful or authoritative status we might feel, but because God's will is accomplished. We go forth in mission as Jesus did, not to be served, but to serve.


