FR. ERIC – RAMBLINGS

FAMILY OF PARISHES PRIESTS LIVING ARRANGEMENTS...

In last week's bulletin, we placed a flyer that contained both the weekend and daily Mass times for all five parishes, along with the Confessions schedule. This week, we would like to share the living arrangements for all four priests. Fr. Eric will be living at St. Mary in Piqua. Fr. Steve Shoup will be living in the Melchizedek Village in West Milton. Fr. Matt Lee will be living in the rectory at Transfiguration parish in West Milton. And finally, Fr. Jim Duell will remain at St. Teresa in Covington. We would like to share the logic that guided the discussions as to where each priest will live. Let's begin with the decision to have Fr. Shoup in Melchizedek Village. Fr. Shoup approached me as soon as the assignments were made and asked if it would be possible for him to live in one of the units reserved for priests who have retired at Melchizedek Village, because he was planning on retiring there. After speaking with the Lange board and the retired priests who are presently living at Melchizedek Village, it was decided this would be good move for Fr. Shoup. Fr. Jim was another easy decision, as he is presently living in Covington and would like to continue to live there. Fr. Lee was given a choice to live in either Troy or West Milton, and he chose to live in West Milton. Fr. Eric's decision to move from one parish within our family of parishes to another was a much harder decision. There were several factors that were considered that ultimately led to the decision to move to St. Mary's rectory. The first and most important point was realizing that most of the parishioners of all five parishes are located more towards the northern part of Miami County.

In next week's bulletins, we will discuss the office assignments for each priests.

BEACONS OF LIGHT FAMILY

REV. STEVEN L. SHOUP

Brief Vitae – Fr. Shoup was born in Troy on May 26, 1955, the third of five children of Irwin and Anna Shoup (both deceased). He attended St. Patrick School and graduated from Troy High School in 1973. He graduated from St. Gregory College Seminary in 1980 and Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in 1984. Fr. Shoup was ordained to the priesthood on June 2, 1984.



His first assignment was Associate Pastor, St. Raphael Church, and teacher at Catholic Central High School, Springfield. His next assignment was Associate Pastor, Our Lady of Victory, Cincinnati, followed by Associate Pastor, Assumption Church, and teacher, La Salle High School, Cincinnati. In 1996, Fr. Shoup was assigned as Associate Pastor, St. Henry Church, Dayton. He became Pastor, St. Michael Church, Ft. Loramie, in 1999 and took on his second parish as pastor, Ss. Peter & Paul Church, Newport, in 2005.

I felt called to the priesthood by God from very early on and was encouraged to become a priest by my family and my parish, especially my late grandmother and the parish priests. The reason I remain a priest is that God continues to call me to His service in the church, and the call keeps coming from others in their encouragement to serve God as a priest. Although the pastoral ministry of priests and pastors is going through some changes and hardships at this time, as the number of priests decreases, God continues to sustain me and my brother priests with His loving and abiding graces and the support of the people we serve. I am very thankful for my vocation.

KNOWING MYSTERY

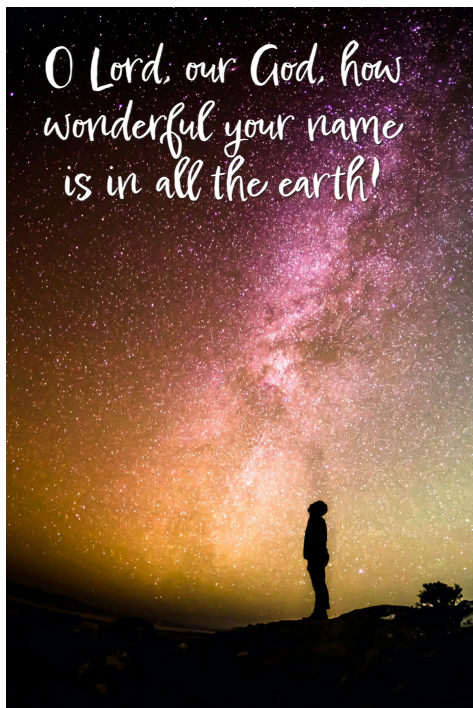
Reflection on John 16:12-15

My early formation in the life of faith, as well as my foundational theological training, unfolded within the Dominican charism of "contemplating truth and sharing with others the fruits of this contemplation." The Gospel writer, John, expresses this charism in a similar manner today: "But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth."

When in the Sacrament of Baptism we are immersed into the very life of the Trinity, we embark on this journey of truth-seeking, of being guided by the Spirit into the life of the Son, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, who draws us home to His Father. The Trinity becomes for us, much less a theological concept to study, but the most certain reality of our journey through life. We are caught up in a relationship of love!

Eugene Peterson, in *Christ Plays in Ten Thousand Places*, says, "It is commonly said that the Trinity is a mystery. And it certainly is... But it is not a mystery veiled in darkness in which we can only grope and guess. It is a mystery in which we are given to understand that we will never know all there is of God... It is not a mystery that keeps us in the dark, but a mystery in which we are taken by the hand and gradually led into the light..."

SAINT ANTHONY OF PADUA

Feast Day: June 13

Patron Saint of Lost Items, Travelers and the Poor

The Gospel call to leave everything and follow Christ was the rule of Saint Anthony of Padua's life. Over and over again, God called him to something new in His plan. Every time, Anthony responded with renewed zeal and self-sacrificing to serve his Lord Jesus more completely.

His journey as the servant of God began as a very young man when he decided to join the Augustinians in Lisbon, giving up a future of wealth and power to be a servant of God. So, Anthony entered the Franciscan Order and set out to preach to the Moors. The call of God came again at an ordination where no one was prepared to speak. The humble and obedient Anthony hesitantly accepted the task. The years of searching for Jesus in prayer, of reading sacred Scripture and of serving Him in poverty, chastity, and obedience had prepared Anthony to allow the Spirit to use his talents. Anthony's sermon was astounding to those who expected an unprepared speech and knew not the Spirit's power to give people words.

Recognized as a great man of prayer and a great Scripture and theology scholar, Anthony became the first friar to teach theology to the other friars. Soon, he was called from that post to preach to the Albigensians in France, using his profound knowledge of Scripture and theology to convert and reassure those who had been misled by their denial of Christ's divinity and of the sacraments..

After he led the friars in northern Italy for three years, he made his headquarters in the city of Padua. He resumed his preaching and began writing sermon notes to help other preachers. In the spring of 1231, Anthony withdrew to a friary at Camposampiero where he had a sort of treehouse built as a hermitage. There, he prayed and prepared for death.

God did with Anthony as God pleased – and what God pleased was a life of spiritual power and brilliance that still attracts admiration today.

I am originally from the northwest of Cincinnati. My home parish is currently St. Ann in Groesbeck. I was homeschooled and after completing high school, I joined college seminary. I spent four years at the Josephinum, where I studied philosophy and other pertinent subjects that prepared me for theology. This past year, I have been at Mt. St. Mary of the West Seminary in Cincinnati, where I just finished my first year of theology. During that time, I received Candidacy and Institution of Lector, both of which are some of the first steps that a seminary makes publicly to the church before being ordained first to the diaconate and then to the priesthood. The first, Candidacy, is when a seminarian declares “to prepare themselves in mind and spirit to give faithful service to Christ the Lord and His body.” The second, Institution of Lector, is a formal recognition, on his part, of the relationship he is called to have with Sacred Scripture and his willingness to apply himself to its study and proclamation for the good of the Church. I look forward to getting to meet all of you and your families and to worship with you in the many liturgies through the summer.
