THE OFFICE ASSIGNMENTS FOR THE PRIESTS...

Over the past two weeks, we have shared the Mass and Confession schedule for all five parishes, as well as where each of the priests will be living. In today's bulletin, we would like to share information regarding the offices for each of the priests. In looking at the office situation of all



five parishes, we quickly realized that we would NOT be able to have an office for each priest at each parish, as there is just not the available space for that idea. The decision was made to have each priest assigned to one parish for his office. We have four cities (Piqua has two churches, but share one office) and each one would have a priest's office. Fr. Eric's office will remain in Troy. Fr. Lee's office will be in Piqua. Fr. Jim's office will remain in Covington. Fr. Shoup's office will be at Transfiguration parish in West Milton.

MULTIPLY


Reflection on Luke 9:11b-17

All three of the Synoptic Gospels make use of the story of the multiplication of the loaves and the fish as a catechesis on both the Eucharist and on ministry. Luke is, perhaps, the clearest teacher in this respect, as this miracle multiplication story is sandwiched between Jesus commissioning the twelve apostles, in which they are instructed to take nothing for the journey, and Peter's profession of faith, proclaiming Jesus as the Messiah of God.

The Eucharist stands at the center of our lives as disciples of Jesus in these concrete ways: it is the celebration of our affirmation and praise of Jesus as Lord and Savior, a Real Presence in the food with which we are nourished (mirroring Peter's profession of faith), and it is a sending forth of us on the mission and work of proclaiming the Kingdom of God (mirroring the commissioning of the Twelve).

The actions of Jesus in the story of the multiplication of the loaves and the fish – taking, blessing, breaking, giving – are clearly intended by Luke to further express a teaching on the Eucharist. The twelve baskets that are left over represent the abundant, extravagant blessing of God – the grace flowing from the Eucharist that will allow those who are nourished by it to bear fruit, 30, 60, or 100 fold!


