It is meant to bring together the leaders (clergy, staff, and councils) of all parishes within the Family of Parishes for prayer and cooperation in its creation. The Archdiocese has asked that the Pastoral Planning team be created for each Family of Parishes by September 1, 2022. Please keep this important task in your prayers. # LISTEN TO LEARN

Reflection on Luke 10:38-42


What is going on in today's Gospel? At first sight it might appear that Martha is a nag and Jesus, a none-too-polite houseguest. From the three stories in which they appear together, however, we know that Jesus and Martha were great friends; hence, it is necessary to understand their interchange within the context of their warm, mutual affection. I think we can glean several messages from this story, but two jump out clearly.

For the Marthas among us – people who aren't happy unless they are doing something – the message is to slow down and make time to listen to God's Word for us. We need this on a regular basis. Unless we listen, we are in no position to learn (the word "disciple" means student), and all our busy-ness will have no relationship to the Kingdom of God.

For all of us, we must confront and not yield to our human tendency to set ourselves up as judges over our neighbor. We cannot presume to evaluate how our neighbor's behavior is reflecting or resisting God's call. We have no way of knowing what God is doing in the hearts of others. What looks like wasting time might be an intense session of discipleship.

# SAINT CAMILLUS DE LELLIS

#### Feast Day: July 18

Patron Saint of Hospitals, Nurses, Healthcare workers and the Sick

Humanly speaking, Camillus was not a likely candidate for sainthood. His mother died when he was a child, his father neglected him, and he grew up with an excessive love for gambling. At 17, he was afflicted with a disease of his leg that remained with him for life.

Then in the winter of 1574, when he was 24, Camillus gambled away everything he had – savings, weapons, literally down to his shirt. He accepted work at the Capuchin friary at Manfredonia, and was one day so moved by a sermon of the superior that he began a conversion that changed his life. He entered the Capuchin novitiate, but was dismissed because of the apparently incurable sore on his leg.

Camillus devoted the rest of his life to the care of the sick. Along with Saint John of God, he has been named patron of hospitals, nurses, and the sick. With the advice of his friend Saint Philip Neri, he studied for the priesthood and was ordained at the age of 34. Charity was his first concern, but the physical aspects of the hospital also received his diligent attention. Camillus insisted on cleanliness and the technical competence of those who served the sick. The members of his community bound themselves to serve prisoners and persons infected by the plague as well as those dying in private homes. Some of his men were with troops fighting in Hungary and Croatia in 1595, forming the first recorded military field ambulance.

Camillus himself suffered the disease of his leg throughout his life. In his last illness, he left his own bed to see if other patients in the hospital needed help.

Saints are created by God. Parents must indeed nurture the faith in their children; husbands and wives must cooperate to deepen their baptismal grace; friends must support each other. But all human effort is only the dispensing of divine power. We must all try as if everything depended on us. But only the power of God can fulfill the plan of God—to make us like Himself.

#### FROM THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE

With Summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish™: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse - Arch. of Cincinnati Edition training or child protection training under the prior child protection platform (VIRTUS). In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprint, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements and should check with their school office or athletic departments if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish<sup>™</sup> quarterly bulletins. As of July 8, there are 10,000+ SafeParish user accounts that are pending due to lack of compliance in completing the quarterly bulletins. With the school year beginning for most in August, please make sure to complete the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish account is approved. 
