TRUE RICHES

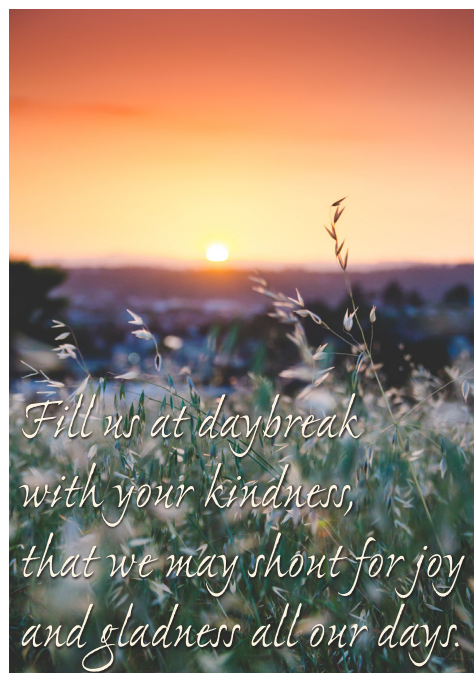
Reflection on Luke 12:13-21

After the death of John D. Rockefeller, one curious fellow actually made an appointment with Rockefeller's financial aide and asked him, "How much did he leave behind?" Without hesitation, the aide replied, "He left all of it." We have all heard the adage, "You can't take it with you." Last Sunday we heard, "Ask, and you shall receive." Today we hear, "hoard, and you shall lose."

This seems to be a fairly straightforward Gospel message about the dangers of amassing material treasure; we hear this same message in other Gospel scenarios (Lazarus and the rich man; the rich young man wanting to follow Jesus; the proverbial camel before the eye of the needle). But in each case, as is true in today's Gospel, the whole "danger of wealth" warning is delivered in a larger context. And that context is stewardship.

One of the primary spiritual principles is the unmerited flow of grace into our lives, which compels the response of keeping God's grace moving by giving it all away. The idea of stewardship is grounded in the knowledge that nothing we have, or are, is truly ours, in the sense of ownership, of possession. To be "rich in what matters to God," is to extend all the graces, material and spiritual, we have received to others, especially those who are most in need.

SAINT JOHN VIANNEY

Feast Day: August 4

Patron Saint of Priests

John Vianney was a man with vision: He wanted to become a priest. But he had to overcome his meager formal schooling, which inadequately prepared him for seminary studies. His failure to comprehend Latin lectures forced him to discontinue. But his vision of being a priest urged him to seek private tutoring. After a lengthy battle with the books, John was ordained.

With Catherine Lassagne and Benedicta Lardet, he established La Providence, a home for girls. Only a man of vision could have such trust that God would provide for the spiritual and material needs of all those who came to make La Providence their home.

His work as a confessor is John Vianney's most remarkable accomplishment. In the winter months he was to spend 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God. In the summer months this time was increased to 16 hours. Unless a man was dedicated to his vision of a priestly vocation, he could not have endured this giving of self day after day. Many people look forward to retirement and taking it easy, doing the things they always wanted to do but never had the time. But John Vianney had no thoughts of retirement. As his fame spread, more hours were consumed in serving God's people. Even the few hours he would allow himself for sleep were disturbed frequently by the devil.

Who, but a man with vision, could keep going with ever-increasing strength? In 1929, Pope Pius XI named him the patron of parish priests worldwide.

Indifference toward religion, coupled with a love for material comfort, seem to be common signs of our times. A person from another planet observing us would not likely judge us to be pilgrim people, on our way to somewhere else. John Vianney on the other hand, was a man on a journey, with his goal before him at all times.

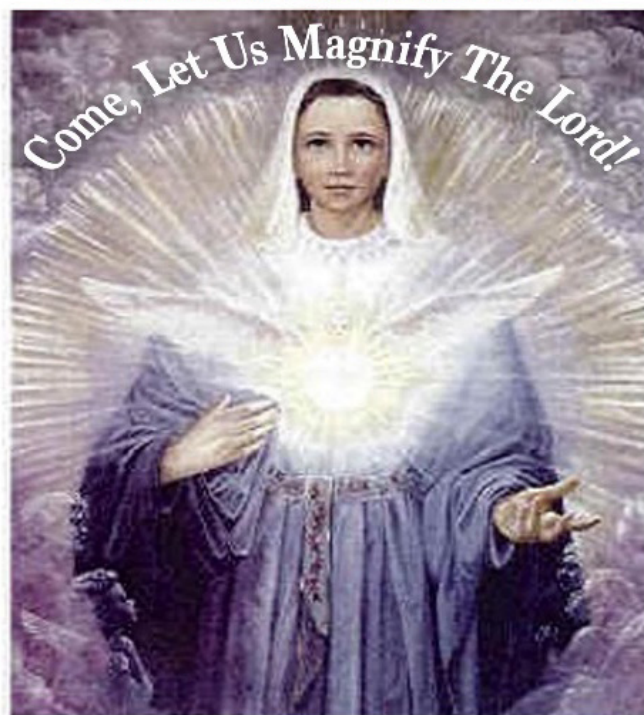

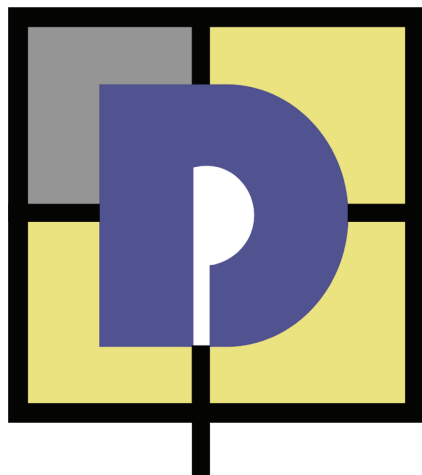
