

LET'S FEAST

Reflection on Luke 14:1,7-14

More than any other Gospel writer, Luke portrays Jesus at meals. He eats not only with tax collectors and sinners, as in Matthew and Mark, but also with friends like Martha and Mary, and He dines frequently with Pharisees, as in today's story.

Luke, I believe, is doing three things with his emphasis on Jesus at meals. He is pointing to the centrality of the Eucharistic meal for us, where Jesus continues to instruct us and form us in our journey to the Father. He is teaching us that the Eucharist is a foretaste, a participation in, and a promise of an eternal banquet; God is the host of a heavenly feast to which all are invited. And Luke is showing us that what we celebrate at Eucharist we must carry into our daily lives and allow to form and shape how we craft all our relationships.

Many of Jesus' most important and challenging teachings are given at these meals. Today, among other things, the virtue of humility is extolled. Humility does not mean beating one's breast and saying how awful one is, or not being allowed to admit one's worth and gifts. Rather, humility is the honest acceptance that all life is gift, and so the only proper attitude is to be grateful, rather than proud.

SAINT AUGUSTINE OF HIPPO

Feast Day: August 28 Patron Saint of Converts to Christianity

A Christian at 33, a priest at 36, a bishop at 41: Many people are familiar with the biographical sketch of Augustine of Hippo, sinner turned saint. But to get to really know the man is a rewarding experience.

There quickly surfaces the intensity with which he lived his life, whether his path led away from or toward God. The tears of his mother, the instructions of Ambrose and, most of all, God Himself speaking to him in the Scriptures, redirected Augustine's love of life to a life of love.

Having been so deeply immersed in creature-pride of life in his early days and having drunk deeply of its bitter dregs, it is not surprising that Augustine should have turned, with a holy fierceness, against the many demon-thrusts rampant in his day. His times were truly decadent: politically, socially, morally. He was both feared and loved, like the Master. The perennial criticism leveled against him: a fundamental rigorism.

In his day, Augustine providentially fulfilled the office of prophet. Like Jeremiah and other greats, he was hard-pressed but could not keep quiet. "I say to myself, I will not mention him/I will speak in his name no more/But then it becomes like fire burning in my heart/imprisoned in my bones/I grow weary holding it in/I cannot endure it" (Jeremiah 20:9).

Augustine is still acclaimed and condemned in our day. He is a prophet for today, trumpeting the need to scrap escapisms and stand face-to-face with personal responsibility and dignity.

I do want to mention that I spent the first 10 days of June on a spiritual journey to Fatima and Lourdes.

When I got home, it was mentioned that I was on vacation. I don't think I would have called this a vacation. Vacation to me is sleeping in, laying on a beach, and relaxing. For the 10 days of this journey, our group spent every minute of every day growing spiritually. We walked in the footsteps of Jacinta, Francisco, and Lucia. We stood in the place where Mary had appeared to them. There was so much, it is hard to put in one bulletin letter. In the evenings, we participated in a candlelight Rosary procession. A statue of Mary is carried and hundreds of people follow praying the Rosary. Our group was offered the opportunity for 4 volunteers to help carry the statue. I was one of the volunteers. This was the most amazing thing I have ever done. The picture shows me carrying my part of the statue. Each volunteer had about 125 lbs. on their shoulders. I cannot put into words how this spiritually affected my whole journey.

After Fatima, we traveled to Lourdes. St. Bernadette is one of my favorite saints. We all participated in drinking water and washing from the spring that Mary pointed out to Bernadette. We visited the little town where Bernadette lived and actually stood in the little jailhouse they used as a home. We had Mass in the grotto where Mary appeared to Bernadette. I brought a lot of the spring water back with me, so if you need some, please let me know.

My journey was breathtaking, prayerful, peaceful, and overwhelming at times, just trying to take in all that we were experiencing. It was an amazing experience and I am grateful for the group I was in. There were about 24 of us, a few from our parishes, and several who had previously taken tours with Father Eric and wanted to experience this opportunity with him as our leader. Thank you, Father Eric, for putting this much-needed spiritual experience together for so many people.

All of the staff at St. Patrick Catholic School want to thank you for your support and want you to know we will be praying for you this year.


