COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND FROM MASS

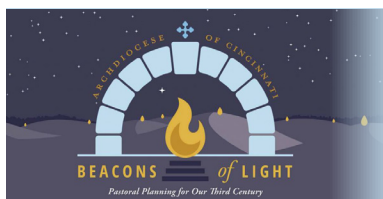
1. Before Mass begins, go to the sacristy and fill your pyx with the number of unconsecrated hosts needed.
2. Place pyx on the designated tray.
3. Following the Prayer after Communion, the priest will call those individuals forward to pick up your pyx.
4. All will stand in a line at the step to the sanctuary.
5. Pick up your pyx and exit the church to take Communion DIRECTLY to the people of God.

CONVOCATION WEEK

1. September 26th-29th, all of the active priests and many of the retired priests of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati will be in West Virginia for our multi-day convocation.
2. Please note that there will be ONLY one Mass per day within the family of parishes.
3. There will be NO Confessions or Adoration.
4. There will be no priest available for funerals.

SOUND SYSTEM UPDATE

As you may have noticed, we have begun the process of updating our sound system! This endeavor has been approved by Parish Council and financed through a generous parishioner bequest. We are working with an actual sound engineer in order to get the best working system we can for our particular situation. We are also planning to instruct those using the ambo in order to better utilize that microphone. All priests will be using head- or ear-piece microphones which will eventually be set to each individual. Due to supply chain shortages, this will not be completed until sometime in the spring. We have also moved the ambo to the side of the sanctuary to help with the sound. Please bear with us and know that we are diligently working on this!

DISHONEST STEWARD

Reflection on Luke 16:1-13

In so many Gospel stories, the response to Jesus by His followers shows that they have no earthly idea what He is about. For example, Peter's wrongheaded suggestion at the mountaintop of the Transfiguration to set up three booths for Elijah, Moses and Jesus.

No response is reported following this story of the dishonest manager, but I can imagine some baffled questions by Jesus' hearers. Why does a guy presented as a crook seem to get praised for even further dishonesty by someone who has just fired him? Just exactly what about this fellow's behavior does Jesus want us to imitate?

Perhaps our take-away from this story is to note that this steward musters every available bit of farsightedness and craft when it comes to working out his material fate. And he is dealing with mere earthly things. If Jesus' disciples could only be half as resourceful at promoting His kingdom as these stewards are at promoting their own selfish welfare, his kingdom would flourish.

The dance of God's grace in our lives is forever showering an abundance of resources upon us. Some of them are material blessings, but even more important are the resources of love, peace, compassion, forgiveness, perseverance. What are we doing with them all? How are we crafting our lives for God?

SAINTS ANDREW KIM TAE-GŎN, PAUL CHŎNG HA-SANG, AND COMPANIONS

Feast Day: September 20

Patron Saint of Korean Clergy

The first native Korean priest, Andrew Kim Tae-gŏn was the son of Christian converts. Following his Baptism at the age of 15, Andrew traveled 1,300 miles to the seminary in Macao, China. After six years, he managed to return to his country through Manchuria. That same year he crossed the Yellow Sea to Shanghai and was ordained a priest. Back home again, he was assigned to arrange for more missionaries to enter by a water route that would elude the border patrol. He was arrested, tortured, and finally beheaded at the Han River near Seoul, the capital.

Andrew's father Ignatius Kim, was martyred during the persecution of 1839, and was beatified in 1925. Paul Chŏng Ha-sang, a lay apostle and married man, also died in 1839 at age 45.

Christianity came to Korea during the Japanese invasion in 1592. Evangelization was difficult because Korea refused all contact with the outside world except for taking taxes to Beijing annually. On one of these occasions, around 1777, Christian literature obtained from Jesuits in China led educated Korean Christians to study. A home Church began. When a Chinese priest managed to enter secretly a dozen years later, he found 4,000 Catholics, none of whom had ever seen a priest. Seven years later there were 10,000 Catholics. Religious freedom came to Korea in 1883.

Besides Andrew and Paul, Pope John Paul II canonized 98 Koreans and three French missionaries who had been martyred between 1839 and 1867, when he visited Korea in 1984.

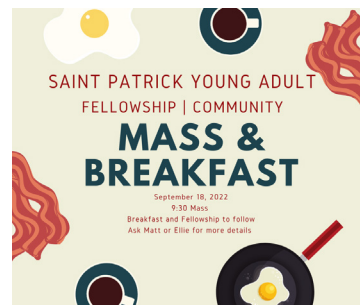

Our team this year is small. Because of the size of the team, the boys are playing both offense and defense. It's a

young team, with some being the first year they have played football. At the beginning of the game, I look over and this picture is what I see. Before they entered the field, they KNEELED and prayed! I was in awe.

During the next hour and a half, these young men played so hard and courageously. We didn't win, but they held their own and gave 110%. As a principal, sometimes I get wrapped up in what I am doing on the business side of things and trying to remember what needs done. It takes times like seeing what I saw that night to remind me of what a difference our faith makes and how we are teaching our students that prayer comes first and to not be afraid. Watching every junior high football player kneeling before a game and putting their trust in God is at the heart of what Catholic schools are about.

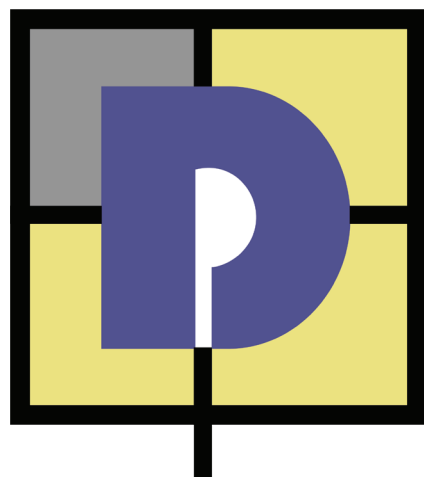

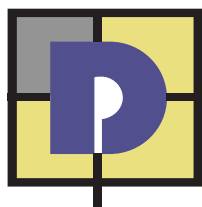
