COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND FROM MASS

1. Before Mass begins, go to the sacristy and fill your pyx with the number of unconsecrated hosts needed.
2. Place pyx on the designated tray.
3. Following the Prayer after Communion, the priest will call those individuals forward to pick up your pyx.
4. All will stand in a line at the step to the sanctuary.
5. Pick up your pyx and exit the church, to take Communion DIRECTLY to the people of God.

PURSUING US

Reflection on Luke 17:11-19

Certainly this story of the cleansing of the ten lepers has something important to say about gratitude, as Jesus points out in the story that only one of the ten returned to give thanks. But the fact that the story is silent about what happened to the other nine is also important. Did they recognize the gift they had received? Were they ungrateful?

What is instructive for us in the story is the fact that the one who did return to give thanks was a foreigner, a Samaritan. Ironically, given the fact that Jesus told them to show themselves to the priests, who by custom were the only ones who could pronounce them cured, the Samaritan is the only one who could not go to the priests. He would not have been welcomed in the temple, because he was a non-believer in the eyes of the Jews.

Perhaps one of the lessons for us in this story is the value of strangers, foreigners, in our midst. God calls all people to Himself. While God's search for us unfolds within the Church, God's search for every one of His children is no less persistent. In lives and beliefs that look strange and foreign to us, God is at work, in God's own way and wisdom.

SAINT TERESA OF AVILA

Feast Day: October 15

Patron Saint of: Relief from headaches

The gift of God to Teresa in and through which she became holy and left her mark on the Church and the world is threefold: She was a woman; she was a contemplative; she was an active reformer.

As a woman, Teresa stood on her own two feet, even in the man's world of her time. She was "her own woman," entering the Carmelites despite strong opposition from her father. Beautiful, talented, outgoing, adaptable, affectionate, courageous, enthusiastic, she was totally human. Like Jesus, she was a mystery of paradoxes: wise, yet practical; intelligent, yet much in tune with her experience; a mystic, yet an energetic reformer; a holy woman, a womanly woman.

Teresa was a woman "for God," a woman of prayer, discipline, and compassion. Her heart belonged to God. Her ongoing conversion was an arduous lifelong struggle, involving ongoing purification and suffering. She was misunderstood, misjudged, and opposed in her efforts at reform. Yet she struggled on, courageous and faithful. And in the midst of all this she clung to God in life and in prayer. Her writings on prayer and contemplation are drawn from her experience: powerful, practical, and graceful. She was a woman of prayer; a woman for God.

Teresa was a woman "for others." Though a contemplative, she spent much of her time and energy seeking to reform herself and the Carmelites, to lead them back to the full observance of the primitive Rule. She founded over a half-dozen new monasteries. She traveled, wrote, fought – always to renew, to reform. In her self, in her prayer, in her life, in her efforts to reform, in all the people she touched, she was a woman for others, a woman who inspired and gave life.

Ours is a time of turmoil, a time of reform, and a time of liberation. Modern women have in Teresa a challenging example.

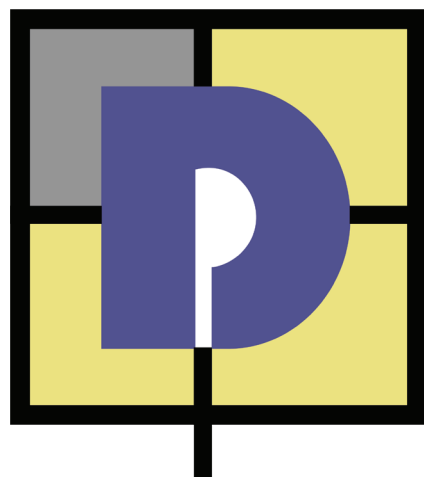

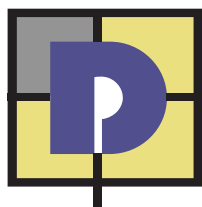
