DREAM COME TO LIFE

Reflection on Matthew 3:1-12

In this season of Advent, as we prepare to celebrate Christ's first arrival on earth, and look forward to His second coming at the end of time, we focus our gaze on the many and varied ways Christ comes among us in these current times. On this second Sunday of Advent, we are given the majesty of Isaiah's dream and the ferocity of John the Baptist's message for our encouragement.

Isaiah's dream is glorious! Arising from the "stump of Jesse" as a blossoming bud is the One who gathers all into His peaceable kingdom, where "the wolf shall be the guest of the lamb," "there shall be no harm or ruin," and "the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the Lord."

Dreams are lovely, but it takes work and time to put them into action, and so John, the Baptist prophet, urges us to conversion, to "give some evidence that you mean to reform." A somewhat harsh but indeed necessary message, calling us to repentance, confession of our sinfulness, and the change that will bear fruit for the kingdom as well as prepare us for the coming of the Lord. Encountering Christ now in the faces of everyone we meet will enable us to bear this fruit of love and service.




