FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

HISTORICAL AND POLITICAL BACKGROUND....

Portugal has a rich Catholic history. Catholicism was the state religion for many centuries until the early 20th century. The Catholic Church began to face many obstacles in Portugal over the past 200 years. Let's look at a few of these obstacles, as they set the stage for Our Lady's appearance in 1917.



In the 18th century, Jose de Carvalho, the Marquis of Pombal, engaged in an open and brutal war against the church. In 1759, he compelled the king to sign an edict expelling the Jesuits from all his states in Portugal. This left the church defenseless against the crude and cruel anti-clerical propaganda.

On February 1, 1908, the king and his son, both Catholic, were assassinated. On October 5, 1910, a republic was established, which inaugurated another period of ferocious persecutions of the church. Only five days after the republic (secularism) had been installed (even though the country was in a disastrous economic situation), a decree was published in which all convents, monasteries, religious orders, etc, were suppressed, all their members were expelled and their goods were confiscated. All these persecutions culminated in the law of separation of Church and state on April 20, 1911. The author of the law, Alfonso Costa, stated, "Thanks to this law of separation, in two generations Catholicism will be completely eliminated from Portugal." This action caught the attention of Pope St. Pius X, who responded with his famous encyclical, *Jamdudum in Lusitania* on May 24, 1911, in which he firmly condemned "the very bad and pernicious law of separation of Church and state."

This is a brief look at the social and political climate of Portugal. In the next article, we will begin to look at how heaven prepared the children to receive the heavenly visits of Our Lady.

He waits for our little acts of faith, Adoration, love, thanksgiving, repentance, reparation and charity that we can offer Him as we contemplate – His Divine Majesty – in the Blessed Sacrament (St. John Paul II)."

There are numerous opportunities in our family of parishes for Adoration. We are also going to be adding times for Adoration of Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Here is a list of opportunities:

- -St. Clare Chapel at St. Boniface. This is perpetual Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Stop in any time of the day or night to spend time with Our Lord. For more information, see the Piqua parish bulletin.
- -Transfiguration Parish. Every Thursday, Our Lord is exposed at the end of the morning Mass and remains exposed all day until 7:00 p.m., when Our Lord is reposed.
- -St. Teresa will begin offering Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesday evenings 5:00-7:00 p.m. during the season of Lent.
- -St. Patrick Parish will be extending the Wednesday Adoration hours to all day. Our Lord will be exposed at the end of morning Mass on Wednesdays, beginning on March 1st, and conclude with Benediction at 8:00 p.m. We are asking St. Patrick parishioners to sign up for a time slot for Adoration. The sign-up sheets are in the back of Church.

HAVE YOU CONSIDERED HAVING A MASS SAID FOR A FAMILY MEMBER OR FRIEND, LIVING OR DECEASED?

When we have a Mass said for a deceased person, we are presuming they are at least in purgatory and that the Mass will help lessen or ease the temporal punishment due to their sins. Normally, the custom is to have a Mass on the anniversary of the death or near to it. You may also want to have it said on the anniversary of their birthdate. A Mass can be said for a donation of \$5.00. You can contact the Parish Office with the names of your loved ones and we will work to accommodate your date requests.

LAW AND LOVE


Reflection on Matthew 5:17-37

The Sermon on the Mount began with Jesus' proclamation of the Beatitudes, and continued last Sunday with Jesus calling us light and salt. Today, this sermon continues as Jesus teaches His disciples a new way of observing the commandments. In his Gospel, Matthew is keen to present Jesus as the new Moses, the great Teacher, who instructs with new and forceful authority.

We first hear that everything in the law will not be abolished, but fulfilled in Jesus. We can interpret this within the context of Jesus' central teaching on the law and the prophets, what we know as "the Great Commandment." Love of God and love of neighbor are, Jesus instructs, the fulfillment of the law and the prophets.

We can then hear these "you have heard it said... but what I say to you" statements of Jesus regarding the ten commandments given by God through Moses, as a movement from exterior observation to interior disposition. Our observance, indeed our fulfillment of God's laws, involves not only behavioral compliance, but also interior attention to the motivations, judgements, thoughts, urges of the will, that give rise to speech and action. All of this scrutiny goes to the movement of our hearts, in a word, our love.




