Reflections on Fatima 3 of 27 – The Angel of Peace visit one.

Heaven sent an angel to prepare the hearts of the children of Fatima for the heavenly visits of our Blessed Mother. Lucia, the oldest of the three children, saw the angel three times in 1915. She never engaged the angel, but usually saw the angel from a distance. But in 1916, the Angel of Peace appeared to the children three times.



The first visit of the angel was in the spring of 1916 at the Loca do Cabeco. The children, Lucia and her two younger cousins Francisco and Jacinta, would take the sheep into the mountains early each day. They would play, but only after they had said their prayers. Now being children, they found ways to pray as fast as they could so they had more time for playing. Sr. Lucia wrote that they would say only the first lines of the Our Father and the Hail Marys to finish their Rosary as quickly as possible. On one occasion, a spring storm popped up on them, so they went to a cave at which time they prayed. They saw approaching them from the east over the little dale "a light, whiter than snow, in the form of a young man, transparent, and brighter than crystal pierced by the rays of the sun. As he drew nearer, we could distinguish his features more and more clearly. We were surprised, absorbed, and struck dumb with amazement." The angel addressed the children, "Fear Not! I am the Angel of Peace. Pray with me." The angel taught the children the first of the prayers of Fatima. The angel had the children kneel prostrate and pray "My God, I believe, I adore, I hope, and I love You! I beg pardon for all those that do not believe, do not adore, do not hope, and do not love You." Then standing, the angel addressed the children, "pray thus; the Hearts of Jesus and Mary are attentive to the voice of your supplication."

In the next article we will explore the second visit of the angel to the children of Fatima.

NON-DISCRIMINATING

Reflection on Matthew 5:38-48

Last week, we heard that our sincere attempts to do as the law requires are not enough, as Jesus said, "Unless you show yourselves far better than the scribes and the Pharisees, you can never enter the kingdom of heaven." Today, this sentiment continues as Jesus' Sermon on the Mount continues with the two paragraphs that are perhaps among the most difficult teachings to hear. They demand a righteousness that may seem to go beyond human possibility. After all, if someone kills, ought he not to be killed in turn? And if someone steals from me, ought I not to exact a penalty?

Yet here is the hard and unapologetic teaching of Jesus - God expects us not to exact any retribution - none at all. God expects us to love everyone, especially those who do not love us, especially those who do not respect us, especially those who do us grievous injury. God expects us to show in our dealings with others the same non-discriminating love God shows to the human family. If we are windows through which God's glory shows itself to the world, then we must act like God; we must forgive those we regard as unforgivable, and we must love even those who seem unlovable. Remember, Jesus Himself lived and died by these words.

SAINT PETER DAMIAN

Feast Day: February 21 Patron Saint of: Faenza and Font-Avellano, Italy

Peter escaped poverty and the neglect of his own brother when his other brother, who was archpriest of Ravenna, took him under his wing. His brother sent him to good schools and Peter became a professor.

Already in those days, Peter was very strict with himself. He wore a hair shirt under his clothes, fasted rigorously and spent many hours in prayer. Soon, he decided to leave his teaching and give himself completely to prayer with the Benedictines of the reform of Saint Romuald at Fonte Avellana.

The abbot commanded that when he died Peter should succeed him. Abbot Peter founded five other hermitages. He encouraged his brothers in a life of prayer and solitude and wanted nothing more for himself. The Holy See periodically called on him, however, to be a peacemaker or troubleshooter, between two abbeys in dispute or a cleric or government official in some disagreement with Rome.

Finally, Pope Stephen IX made Peter the cardinal-bishop of Ostia. He worked hard to wipe out simony – the buying of church offices – and encouraged his priests to observe celibacy and urged even the diocesan clergy to live together and maintain scheduled prayer and religious observance. He wished to restore primitive discipline among religious and priests, warning against needless travel, violations of poverty, and too comfortable living. He even wrote to the bishop of Besancon complaining that the canons there sat down when they were singing the psalms in the Divine Office.

With the monks gathered around him saying the Divine Office, he died on February 22, 1072. In 1828, he was declared a Doctor of the Church.

We all need some encouragement these days. So simple and fun.




ADULT FAITH FORMATION




