FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 7 of 27:

After Our Lady appeared....

Before we continue, it is important for us to look at the response of the village, in particular Lucia's mother, to the claim the children saw the "beautiful Lady." At the time of the apparitions, the children were 10, 8, and 7 years old. Lucia was the oldest and Jacinta was the youngest. During all



the apparitions (both the angel and Mary), all three could see, but only Lucia and Jacinta could hear and only Lucia spoke. After the first visit from Mary, the children agreed that they would keep all things a secret to themselves. But this promise didn't last very long, for no sooner did the children reach the village of *Aljustrel* (where they lived), than the young Jacinta told her parents that, "they had seen the beautiful lady." This claim spread quickly through the village and led to great suffering for all of the children, but especially Lucia. Lucia's mother was sort of the "matriarch of the village." She was very respected and therefore, took great offense at the rumblings for she believed it embarrassed her and her family. She made it her goal to force Lucia to tell the "truth." At one point, Lucia recalls her mother dragging her through the town to the church so that Lucia could confess to the priest her sin of lying. This type of response from her mother continued for most of Lucia's childhood.

The sharing of this information is important, as the children were preparing for the second visit of Our Lady. Our Lady was to visit on June 13th, the feast of St. Anthony of Padua. This is one of the most important feast days for the Portuguese people. St. Anthony was born in Lisbon, Portugal. The young people always looked forward to the festival following church for this feast. Lucia's mother was convinced that Lucia would not miss the festival. In the next article, we will explore the June visit of Our Lady.


CHURCH ROOF UPDATE



RECEIVING HEALING


Reflection on John 9:1-41

In today's Gospel, John offers another dramatic story describing the healing of a man born blind and a range of responses to this healing. The experience of healing itself involves both the action of Jesus – using mud and spittle to smear on the man's eyes – and the response and cooperation of the man who must go and wash in the pool of Siloam, which means "sent." With physical sight restored, and spiritual sight awakened, this man is now "sent" as a witness to Jesus.

But look at the reactions! Accusations of sin all over the place. Mistrust, denial and division among the religious leaders. Too frightened of the controversy to get involved from the parents. Confusion from neighbors. What do we make of all this?

Jesus, the Light of the World, came to dispel darkness and sin. How do we experience and receive this healing for ourselves and others? Do we see reality with the eyes of faith when the Light of Christ exposes falsehood and reveals truth that is uncomfortable? Are we at times so comfortable with our blindness that we prefer ignorance over enlightenment? These are all good questions, prompted from the Gospel, for us to consider during this Lenten journey.

AN EVENING OF PRAYER FOR THOSE WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED THE LOSS OF A CHILD






