FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 8 of 27: Preparing for the second visit of Our Lady The second heavenly visit from Our Blessed Mother took place on June 13, 1917, the feast of St. Anthony of Padua, unless you are from Portugal, and there, he is known as St. Anthony of Lisbon. The feast day of St. Anthony is one of the biggest feasts in Portugal, with huge parties, especially among the young people.



But before we jump into the second heavenly visit, we need to revisit the May visit and the consequences of Jacinta's impulsive "We saw the beautiful lady." After the Blessed Mother left the children on May 13, 1917, the three seers, Lucia – 10, Francisco – 9, Jacinta – 7, all agreed not to tell anyone about seeing the Blessed Mother. But little Jacinta, probably inspired to do so, cried out to her parents, "we saw the beautiful lady." The results of this confession were brutal, to say the least, for Lucia. Her mother was convinced that she was lying and had convinced her two younger cousins' to join the lie, to get attention. Lucia's sister, Maria dos Anjos, recalled the following dialogue with her mother:

"Our mother knew well how Lucia loved the fiesta, and she hoped the whole story of the Cova da Iria would pass with it. It is a good thing that we are having St. Anthony tomorrow," she said, "and we mustn't say anything to Lucia about going to the Cova. We must talk of nothing but the feast so that by tomorrow, she will have forgotten the other foolishness." We were very careful to do what our mother told us, but of all our plans and preparations, Lucia seemed to take little notice. Except that once in a while, she would remind us, "Tomorrow, I'm going to the Cova da Iria; that is what the Lady told us we must do."

While Francisco and Jacinta's parents were not as hostile as Lucia's mother, they still could not understand why their children would choose "the lie" over the feast of St. Anthony.






Reflection on John 11:1-45

Few scenes give a more startling revelation of God's infinitely lavish power than the image of Lazarus at the entrance of his own grave, still swaddled in death's tight linens, but alive! And I imagine that the Lord's prophecy, put on the lips of Ezekiel, echoed in the ears of those who witnessed this marvel. "Then you will know that I am the Lord," he said, "when I open your graves and have you rise from them." Nothing is beyond God's power. It is never too late. With God's own Spirit within us, all things are possible. Easter will come.

While the story of the raising of Lazarus foreshadows Jesus' own Resurrection, there is more going on in the story, as is usual with John's Gospel. I think one of the most significant is the fact that Jesus involves the assistance of others in this raising from the dead miracle. He tells them to "take away the stone," to "unbind him" and to "let him go free." These are not simple requests, they are imperatives, commands that call for immediate action.

What are the stones that have become a barrier between living fully in Christ and what I keep to myself? What are the stones that are barriers between me and others, that hold my loving back? What part do we play in binding others, in preventing loving relationships to grow? There are many ways we can unbind others and let them go free - by forgiving them, through letting go of grudges and resentments and grievances. A helping hand, a loving word, a compassionate deed, can all begin the process of taking away the stone from the life of one who needs to be set free.

Show me how to unlock my heart


so that I am less selfish.




