FR. ERIC – RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 5 of 27: The third and final visit from the Angel of Peace.

The final visit from the angel was back where it began at the Loca do Cabeco. The children were praying when they saw the angel before them “holding a chalice in his hands, with a host above it from which some drops of blood were falling into the Sacred vessel.” The Angel left the chalice and host suspended in the air, and prostrated himself upon the ground with the children and prayed the following prayer with them three times: *O Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences by which He is offended. By the infinite merits of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary I beg the conversion of poor sinners.*

This was the last visit of the Angel to the three children. We cannot express more perfectly what the Angel accomplished in his mission than by recalling Lucy's own words: “Impelled by the power of the supernatural that enveloped us, we imitated all that the Angel had done, prostrating ourselves on the ground as he did and repeating the prayers that he said. The force of the presence of God was so intense that it absorbed us and almost completely annihilated us. It seemed to deprive us even of the use of our bodily senses for a considerable length of time. During those days, we performed all our exterior actions as though guided by that same supernatural being who was impelling us thereto. The peace and happiness which we felt were great, but wholly interior, for our souls were completely immersed in God.”

Christ is there in the Blessed Sacrament waiting for us; how willing our Angel is to pray with us, to strengthen us in our prayers and sacrifices. Nothing is lacking for us to become holy.

Clarification...

I would like to clarify a statement I made in my homily dated February 19. In my homily I stated that the church did not change the tradition of not eating meat on all Fridays throughout the year. I went on to say that in the 1980s the United States Bishop Conference gave permission for the eating of meat on Friday. The first point of clarification is that the United States Bishop Conference made this statement in the 1960s. In 1966 the United States Episcopal conference put out a document entitled: “Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence,” in which they stated in several paragraphs, under the title, that Christ Died for Our Salvation on Friday:

In the following paragraphs they discuss the economic, dietary and social elements that have changed over time, in which meat (once an exceptional form of food) is now commonplace. “Accordingly, since the spirit of penance primarily suggests that we discipline ourselves in that which we enjoy most, to many in our day abstinence from meat no longer implies penance, while renunciation of other things would be more penitential. For these and related reasons, the Catholic bishops of the United States, far from downgrading the traditional observance of Friday, and motivated precisely by the desire to give the spirit of penance greater vitality, especially on Fridays, the day that Jesus died, urge our Catholic people to be guided by the following norms. *Friday should be in each week something of what Lent is in the entire year. For this reason we URGE all to prepare for that weekly Easter that comes with each Sunday by freely making every Friday a day of self-denial and mortification in prayerful remembrance of the passion of Jesus Christ. Among the works of voluntary self-denial and personal penance which we especially commend to our people for the future observance of Friday, even though we terminate the traditional law of abstinence binding under pain of sin, as the sole prescribed means of observing Friday, WE GIVE FIRST PLACE TO ABSTINENCE FROM FLESH MEAT. We do so in the hope that the Catholic community will ordinarily continue to abstain from meat by free choice as formerly we did in obedience to Church Law.*

As you can see from the above article, the church still calls us to penance/fasting/self-denial on all Fridays (unless a Solemnity falls on a Friday). What the US Bishops did, was to remove the moral obligation to abstain from eating meat on Friday. So if you eat meat on Friday, it is no longer a sin. BUT we are, as I mentioned in my homily, required to do some other form of self-denial. So in conclusion, the United States Bishops Conference, allowed for the eating of meat, if it was no longer sacrificial. The person who eats meat on Fridays, outside of Lent, does not incur the weight of sin for the actions. BUT the Bishops stated that we must treat all Fridays as if they are Fridays of Lent, by uniting our suffering with Christ's suffering. “Catholic peoples from time immemorial have set apart Friday for special penitential observances by which they gladly suffer with Christ.”

LISTEN

Reflection on Matthew 17:1-9

The transfiguration scene is packed with symbolism, majesty and mystery. There is so much to fill us, like the disciples, with awe. I invite you to focus on a single word in the story, the word, "listen."

When the Father speaks to Peter, James and John from the cloud, he says, "'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased, listen to him.'"

How do we listen to Jesus? Vatican II says, "Christ is present in his word, since it is he himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in church." This really is "the Word of the Lord" that is proclaimed at Mass. Is our listening, our hearing of Jesus, as earnestly and breathlessly open as it is to the other voices that speak to us in this world? Do our hearts burn within us, as with the disciples on the road to Emmaus, when Jesus talks to us? Can we listen to Jesus speaking to our hearts as powerfully and as truly as someone we profoundly love speaks to us?

A wonderful way to prayerfully prepare for every Mass is to say, with Samuel, "Speak Lord, for your servant is listening."

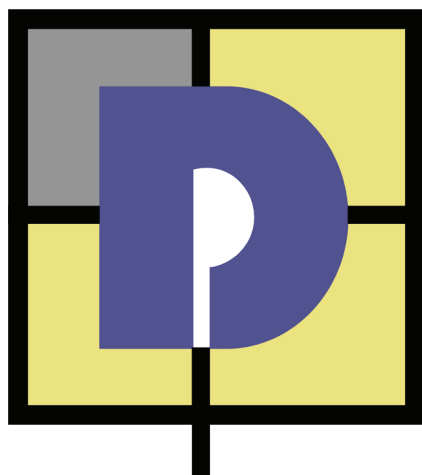
