FR. ERIC – RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 11 of 27

July 13 continued: Jacinta and Francisco the fear and doubt of Lucia
In the last article we saw that the devil was playing on the growing fear and doubt in the heart of Lucia. In this article we see how that impacted the other two seers.

Lucia wrote: "I made my doubts known to my cousins. Jacinta replied: 'It's not the devil! They say the devil is very ugly and that he is under the earth, in hell; but that Lady is so beautiful! And we saw her go up to heaven.'"

The doubt kept gnawing at Lucia's mind, as she herself confessed with simplicity: "During that month, I lost enthusiasm for making sacrifices and acts of self-denial. I debated whether I should say that I had lied just so that then everything would stop."

This is exactly what the devil wanted, he wanted to put a stop to the heavenly intervention. From the beginning, the prince of darkness must have perceived, by the fruits that the children manifested in their lives, that these events would work against him. Faced with the temptation of putting an end to all her suffering by saying that she had lied, Lucia was again helped by the youthful wisdom of her cousins, who said: "Don't do that! Don't you see that then you would really be lying, and lying is a sin?"

"In this state of mind, I had a dream that increased the darkness of my spirit: I saw the devil laughing for having deceived me, and trying to drag me to hell. Upon seeing myself in his clutches, I began to scream so loudly calling Our Lady that I woke up my mother. She called me anxiously and asked me what was wrong. I don't remember what I told her. I only remember that on that night, I couldn't sleep anymore because I was so crippled with fear. That dream left my spirit in a cloud of true fear and anguish. My only relief was to be alone in some lonely corner to cry freely."

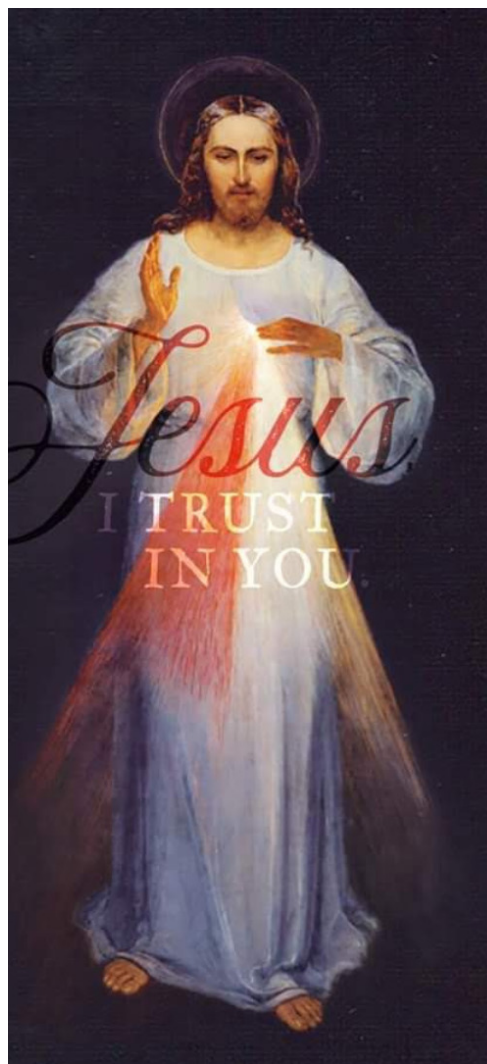

It is going deeply into our wounds which sin has caused, where we are in contact with the wounds of Christ which redeem us. Praise God for His great mercy!

SAINT ANSELM

Feast Day: April 21

At 15, Anselm wanted to enter a monastery, but was refused acceptance because of his father's opposition. Twelve years later, after careless disinterest in religion and years of worldly living, he finally fulfilled his desire to be a monk. He entered the monastery of Bec in Normandy, was elected prior three years later, and 15 years later, was unanimously chosen abbot.

Considered an original and independent thinker, Anselm was admired for his patience, gentleness, and teaching skill. Under his leadership, the Abbey of Bec became a monastic school, influential in philosophical and theological studies. During these years, at the community's request, Anselm began publishing his theological works, comparable to those of Saint Augustine. His best-known work is the book *Cur Deus Homo* ("Why God Became Man").

Against his will, Anselm was appointed archbishop of Canterbury in 1093, at age 60. His appointment was opposed at first by England's King William Rufus and later accepted. Rufus persistently refused to cooperate with efforts to reform the Church. Anselm finally went into voluntary exile until Rufus died in 1100. He was then recalled to England by Rufus' brother and successor, Henry I. Disagreeing fearlessly with Henry over the king's insistence on investing England's bishops, Anselm spent another three years in exile in Rome.

His care and concern extended to the very poorest people. Opposing the slave trade, Anselm obtained from the national council at Westminster the passage of a resolution prohibiting the sale of human beings.

Like every true follower of Christ, Anselm had to carry his cross, especially in the form of opposition and conflict with those in political control. Though personally a mild and gentle man and a lover of peace, he would not back off from conflict and persecution when principles were at stake.

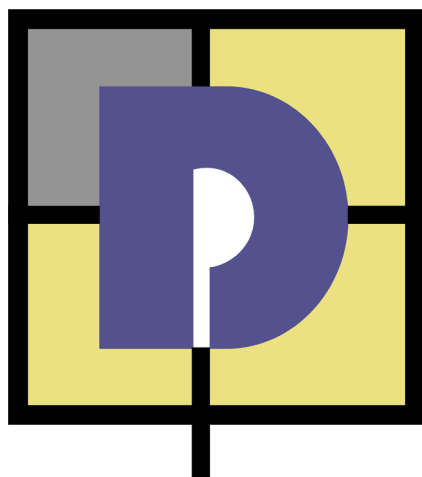
