#### FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

#### Reflections on Fatima 12 of 27

July 13 continued:

The more Lúcia thought about the matter, the more she was set against returning to the Cova da Iria. Besides, the temptation was attractive. In that way, without much trouble, she could put an end to all the complications and sufferings. Without knowing why, she began to feel annoyed at the company of Jacinta and Francisco



and tried to avoid them. Her mother redoubled her efforts to dissuade her from returning to the Cova da Iria for the next apparition. Lúcia's two cousins suffered also, not because of any doubt, but because they were sorry for her, precisely because they were convinced that the visitor to the Cova da Iria really was Our

"Francisco suffered the most from this, and sometimes he complained to Jacinta. He would tell her that if she had only kept quiet, nobody would have known about it. Now they couldn't undo what had been done. With all his strength and all the reasons he could muster, Francisco set about convincing Lúcia she had to be present in the Cova da Iria on July 13. When he saw her perplexed, doubting, and wondering whether, in fact, it had been the devil who appeared to them, he would weep and urge her to go. He would ask her how she could possibly think it had been the devil. Hadn't she seen Our Lady in the great light? But even more, how could he and Jacinta go without Lúcia, when she did all the talking? After supper, when it was already dark, Francisco went again to Lúcia's house in a last effort to convince her. The meeting took place at the old threshing floor, the scene of so many happy moments for the three of them, looking up at the stars and talking about them in their childish fashion. Now it was a scene of sorrow. Francisco asked tearfully, hoping to get a positive answer: "Look, are you going tomorrow?" "I'm not going; I already told you I am not going back anymore." "That's too bad! Why are you thinking like that now? Don't you see it can't be the devil? God is already so sad on account of so many sins, and now if you don't go, you will make Him even sadder! Come on, come with us!" "I already told you that I am not going; there's no use asking me." I went abruptly into the house. A few days later he said to me: "Do you believe it? That night I did not sleep at all. I spent the whole night crying and praying so that Our Lady would make you go." The imperturbable determination of Jacinta and Francisco must have impressed Lúcia deeply and increased her interior suffering. They told her resolutely: "We're going. The Lady said we were to go."9"

"She asked Jacinta why she was crying, and the girl told Lúcia it was because Lúcia didn't want to go to the Cova. Lúcia reaffirmed her intention not to go and asked Jacinta to explain to the Lady why she would not be there: "No, I'm not going. Look! If the Lady asks you about me, tell her I'm not going because I'm afraid she may be the devil."

#### SAINT PETER CHANEL

Feast Day: April 28 Patron Saint of: Oceania

Anyone who has worked in loneliness, with great adaptation required and with little apparent success, will find a kindred spirit in Peter Chanel.

Born in France, Peter's interest in the missions began in school, when he read letters missionaries to America sent back home. As a young priest, Peter revived a parish in a "bad" district by the simple method of showing great devotion to the sick. Wanting to be a missionary, he joined the Society of Mary, the Marists, at 28. Obediently, he taught in the seminary for five years. Then, as superior of seven Marists, he traveled to Western Oceania. The bishop accompanying the missionaries left Peter and a brother on Futuna Island northeast of Fiji, promising to return in six months. He was gone five years.

Meanwhile, Peter struggled with this new language and mastered it, making the difficult adjustment to life with whalers, traders, and warring natives. Despite little apparent success and severe want, he maintained a serene and gentle spirit, plus endless patience and courage. A few natives had been baptized, a few more were being instructed. When the chieftain's son asked to be baptized, persecution by the chieftain reached a climax. Father Chanel was clubbed to death.

Within two years after his death, the whole island became Catholic and has remained so. He was canonized by Pope Pius XII in 1954. Peter Chanel is the first martyr of Oceania and its patron.

Suffering for Christ means suffering because we are like Christ. Very often the opposition we meet is the result of our own selfishness or imprudence. A Christian martyr is one who, like Christ, is simply a witness to God's love, and brings out of human hearts the good or evil that is already there.


