FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 10 of 27

July 13th visit: overcoming the growing fear and doubt.

The July visit was probably the most important and the most challenging of the visits of Our Lady. As a result, we will spend the next few weeks looking at several aspects of the July visit.



As they drew closer to the appointed time for the July visit from Heaven, Lucia felt herself immersed more and more in a sea of anguish. At her meeting with the priest of Fátima, she had been received with the greatest courtesy and kindness. The priest had listened to her with deep attention. The simplicity and realism with which the little shepherd girl spoke of the events in the Cova da Iria left no room for doubt about her sincerity. But the priest's suggestion that it all might have come from the devil opened a wound in Lúcia's heart. "This could also be a deceit of the devil!" These words tore into her, and from that moment on she had no peace. "Only Our Lord knows how much these words made me suffer, for He alone can penetrate our inmost heart. I began then to have doubts that these manifestations might be from the devil, who was seeking in this way to make me lose my soul" (From Fatima in Lucia's own words).

As if this inner anxiety were not enough, her mother kept repeating to her that it was all from the devil, hoping that Lúcia would retract and admit that she had lied. In Lúcia's innocent child's mind, various events were mixed together, along with ideas she had gotten from the spiritual books that her family read together in the evening. Lúcia was an intelligent child, prone to reflection. When she was away from her cousins, taken up with household tasks or in the silence of the night, she turned this question over and over in her mind. The girl twisted and turned, unable to sleep because of her inner turmoil and the summer's heat. In light of what the priest had said, Lúcia began to analyze everything that had happened: "Since I heard it said that the devil always brings conflict and disorder, I began to think that ever since these things had happened, there was no more joy or peace in our house."


EASTER FAITH




