FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 18 of 27

August 13 continued: a second attempt by the authorities.

The civil authorities wanted to know the secret because they hoped to find that an astute cleric was behind all this agitation. The first assault of Artur



de Oliveira Santos had failed. He was not a man to give up at the first obstacle. Two days later, early in the morning on Monday, the day announced for the fourth apparition, he appeared at Ti Marto's house. The official ordered him to tell António Santos to bring his daughter in for a further interrogation.

Lúcia records this second encounter with the administrator: "When I arrived, he was in a room with my cousins. He interrogated us there, making new attempts to force us to reveal the secret and to promise that we would not return to the Cova da Iria. Since he didn't succeed, he ordered my father and my uncle to bring us to the pastor's house."

"When the children and their families refused to accept his offer of a car ride, the administrator then said that he would wait for them at the pastor's house to ask them some further questions. With this clever trick of making the appointment at the pastor's house, near the church, he would gain several advantages: he would escape the vigilance of the crowds on the roads; he would win the confidence of the children and of those present; he could question them at his convenience, using promises and threats as he would do, hours later, in Ourém. Even more, he contemptibly involved the pastor in this hateful plot to remove the children from the Cova da Iria, where a great crowd awaited their arrival at the usual time of the apparition. On the other hand, the pastor agreed to the interrogation in his house, whether to show his complete lack of interest in the apparitions, or perhaps because he hoped that the administrator would solve the whole complicated problem."

"With the administrator looking on, the priest questioned Lúcia first. He wasn't calm and attentive as he had been at the first interrogation, after the June apparition. His questions were not gentle, showing clearly that the priest seemed primarily interested in washing his hands of everything that was happening. He asked Lúcia: 'Who taught you those things that you are going around saying?' 'That Lady whom I saw at the Cova da Iria.' 'Anyone who goes around spreading lies that cause as much harm as the lie that you three told will be judged and go to hell if it isn't true – all the more so because many people have been deceived by you.' 'If whoever lies goes to hell, then I'm not going because I don't lie. I say only what I have seen and what the Lady said to me. And as for the people who go there, only those who wish go; we don't invite anyone.' The pastor's interrogation returned to the secret, the subject that aroused the most curiosity. Lúcia answered him politely, but she also left the door open to continue the conversation later: 'Look, if you like, I'll go up there and ask the Lady for permission to tell the secret, and if she allows me, I'll tell you."

An Our Lady of Fatima Update

- *Beacons of Light* updates will be regularly noted in the bulletin as steps toward our churches' unification into one parish continue to gain momentum.
- Pathway Planning Subcommittees have been building a one-year strategic plan. The
 process is moving along very smoothly with voices from each of our five churches
 represented and collaborating.
- The Archdiocese of Cincinnati completed an Annual Report focusing on the six main principles of *Beacons of Light* (Eucharist, Church, Stewardship, Leadership, Evangelization, Love in Action, and now the addition of Administration and Communication). Whereas, not every family of parishes can report this, Fr. Eric and our Pathway Planning Team are pleased to share that we have met a majority of the milestones set for year-one of this detailed process!
- A requirement and support structure called Family Leadership Team (FLT) has been established. The FLT is made up of department heads who report directly to the pastor and supervise other staff; every other staff member reports up through one of these leaders. Our FLT will initially include the Director of Religious Education, Director of Youth Formation, Chief Finance Officer, Director of Liturgy & Worship, School Principals and the Vicars. Another position might be added to FLT in the future.
- The current parish councils of our five churches have been working on the formation of our unified Pastoral Council, which is on target to be in place by fall 2023.

- Please take part in our new Parish Directory by selecting your photo session this summer. As we unify, this will be a fantastic resource for our parishioners and clergy to familiarize ourselves with each other and the churches within our parish family.




CONFESSION SCHEDULE

SAINT BONIFACE

Feast Day: June 5 Patron Saint of: Germany

Boniface, known as the apostle of the Germans, was an English Benedictine monk who gave up being elected abbot to devote his life to the conversion of the Germanic tribes. Two characteristics stand out: his Christian orthodoxy and his fidelity to the pope of Rome.


How absolutely necessary this orthodoxy and fidelity were is borne out by the conditions Boniface found on his first missionary journey in 719 at the request of Pope Gregory II. Paganism was a way of life. What Christianity he did find had either lapsed into paganism or was mixed with error. The clergy were mainly responsible for these latter conditions since they were in many instances uneducated, lax and questionably obedient to their bishops. In particular instances their very ordinations were questionable.

These are the conditions that Boniface was to report in 722 on his first return visit to Rome. The Holy Father instructed him to reform the German Church. The pope sent letters of recommendation to religious and civil leaders. Boniface later admitted that his work would have been unsuccessful without a letter of safe-conduct from Charles Martel, the Frankish ruler, grandfather of Charlemagne. Boniface was finally made a regional bishop and authorized to organize the whole German Church. He was eminently successful. During a final mission to the Frisians, Boniface and 53 companions were massacred while he was preparing converts for confirmation.

Boniface bears out the Christian rule: To follow Christ is to follow the way of the cross. For Boniface, it was not only physical suffering or death, but the painful, thankless, bewildering task of Church reform. Missionary glory is often thought of in terms of bringing new persons to Christ. It seems—but is not—less glorious to heal the household of the faith.


