FR. ERIC – RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 15 of 27 – July 13 concluded

The July visit from heaven brings with it a plethora of avenues to explore... We could discuss the three secrets, we could focus on the vision of hell and explore that, we can discuss the dialogue of Lucia and Mary... just to name a few. In the last part of our hour today, we are going to focus on the doubt and fear of Lucia...

Put yourself in this young girl's place...you are 10 years old....your mother is convinced you are lying to the town (and in doing so making her life miserable), your siblings are mocking you at every turn, the terrible dreams that seem so real of the lovely lady turning into the devil, and then the priest – the moral leader of your life tells you, "This could also be a deceit of the devil!" It is easy to understand the fear and the doubt that crept into her heart. As is the case with most of us, the unknown is the source of our fear especially in terms of doing the Will of God. I was talking to a young adult recently... and the topic of doing what God wants came up and this person admitted how afraid they were... because they didn't know if they were truly following God's will or their own. We ask God to reveal to us His Will... but rarely does God answer us directly. Because we walk by faith, not by sight.

Faith is the basis of the entire spiritual life. It is our faith that allows us and encourages us to believe in a God we cannot see but can feel His love and presence in our life. Faith draws us closer to God and His Will. And like Mary at the Annunciation, we cry out in Faith, "Let it be done unto me according to Your word," even though we don't know how the Will of God will be carried out or will play out in our lives, faith allows us to say yes. But in saying "yes" to the unknown, it opens the door for fear and doubt, the playground of the evil one. Lucia pulled away from God (she stopped praying), she pulled away from the other two seers, and allowed the fear and doubt to draw her close to denying the heavenly visits. Fear paralyzed her and fear and doubt can have the same effect on us when we give the fear and doubt/the evil one too much power. St. Peter denied Our Lord three times, while in the grip of fear. St. Thomas doubted that the Lord was Risen... maybe because it seemed too hard to believe – in other words, he lacked the faith necessary to believe all things are possible for God. Later in this series we will circle back to the dialogue of July and examine what are commonly known as the three secrets of Fatima.

On Saturday, May 20, 2023, Archbishop Dennis will ordain seven men to the priesthood. This in and of itself is cause for great joy, but for Our Lady of Fatima the ordination brings even more JOY as our own Deacon Jeff Stephens will be ordained. For the parishioners of Covington and Piqua, Deacon Jeff did his pastoral internship year at Transfiguration and St. Patrick. Fr. Eric will be spending most of the weekend with "the soon-to-be" Fr. Stephens, celebrating with his family and concelebrating his Mass of thanksgiving on Sunday morning in Cincinnati at his home parish. I am very grateful to the retired priests that will be covering the Masses. Please keep Deacon Jeff and his classmates in your prayers.

Reflection on John 14:15-21



SAINT ISIDORE THE FARMER

Feast Day: May 15

Patron Saint of: Farmers

When he was barely old enough to wield a hoe, Isidore entered the service of John de Vergas, a wealthy landowner from Madrid, and worked faithfully on his estate outside the city for the rest of his life. He married a young woman as simple and upright as himself who also became a saint – Maria de la Cabeza. They had one son, who died as a child.

Isidore had deep religious instincts. He rose early in the morning to go to church and spent many a holiday devoutly visiting the churches of Madrid and surrounding areas. All day long, as he walked behind the plow, he communed with God. His devotion, one might say, became a problem, for his fellow workers sometimes complained that he often showed up late because of lingering in church too long.

He was known for his love of the poor, and there are accounts of Isidore's supplying them miraculously with food. He had a great concern for the proper treatment of animals. He died May 15, 1130, and was declared a saint in 1622, with Saints Ignatius of Loyola, Francis Xavier, Teresa of Avila, and Philip Neri. Together, the group is known in Spain as "the five saints."

Many implications can be found in a simple laborer achieving sainthood: Physical labor has dignity; sainthood does not stem from status; contemplation does not depend on learning; the simple life is conducive to holiness and happiness. Legends about angel helpers and mysterious oxen indicate that his work was not neglected and his duties did not go unfulfilled. Perhaps the truth which emerges is this: If you have your spiritual self in order, your earthly commitments will fall into order also. "[S]eek first the kingdom [of God] and his righteousness," said the carpenter from Nazareth, "and all these things will be given you besides" (Matthew 6:33).

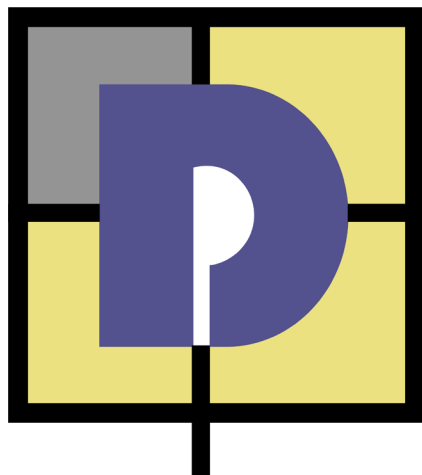
