FR. ERIC – RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 17 of 27

August 13 continued: attempts to silence the children.

The Administration summoned the parents of the shepherds to appear before them on August 11, 2017, at noon. Sr. Lucia wrote about this event, “The administration is in Vila Nova de Ourém, and so we had to travel about nine miles, quite a considerable distance for three children our size. The only way to travel at that time was either on foot or on a donkey. My uncle stated right away that he would appear, but he wouldn’t bring his children: “The children couldn’t walk such a long distance, and they can’t manage to ride on a donkey because they aren’t used to it. Besides, it doesn’t make sense to bring two children of that size before a court.”⁴

Lúcia’s parents thought differently, confused as they were by this avalanche of unexpected events. My father said: “I’m taking my daughter there, because I don’t understand anything about these matters, and I don’t know what I could say.” My mother actually seemed pleased and said: “Take her, take her. They can’t harm a child so small. Perhaps now these men who don’t want prayers or anything to do with God or Our Lady will get her to confess she lied. Then all this will end once and for all.

Sr. Lucia, “At the administration office, I was interrogated by the administrator in the presence of my father, my uncle, and various other gentlemen whom I didn’t know. The administrator wanted to force me to reveal the secret to him, and to promise him that I would never return to the Cova da Iria. To attain this, he spared neither promises nor threats. Seeing that he wasn’t succeeding, he sent me away, protesting that he would make me do it even if that meant taking my life. He strongly reprimanded my uncle for not having carried out his orders, and finally he let us go home.”



This past Saturday, May 20th, Archbishop Schnurr ordained seven men to the priesthood. It was a beautiful day for those seven men and their families and friends and for the archdiocese of Cincinnati. Please keep these men in your prayers.

FIXING THE ROOF (HOPEFULLY)



THE WORK OF THE SPIRIT

Reflection on John 20:19-23

One of the most intriguing parts of the Pentecost story is when we find this large crowd of people "from every nation under heaven" able to hear the apostles speaking in their own languages. This is the reversal of the Tower of Babel story, in which we find the Babylonians attempting to construct a tower that would reach the heavens. Their project is thwarted by God, who makes the folks unable to communicate with each other, creating a diversity of languages. The work of pride divides; the works of the Spirit unites.

This puts me in mind of the Flannery O'Connor story, "All That Rises Must Converge." While we each pray and speak to God in our own style and language, these individual and communal prayers that "rise like incense" are a sweet fragrance that converge upon the heavens, reaching the ear of God as praise, thanksgiving, supplication, the groaning of the human heart. The language that God speaks to us, to the whole of the human race, through the power of the Holy Spirit, is the language of Love, and no translation is needed.


