Reflections on Fatima 14 of 27

July 13 continued: Vision of Hell

As Our Lady spoke these last words, She opened Her hands once more, as She had done during the two previous months. The rays of light seemed to penetrate the earth, and we saw as it were a sea of fire. Plunged in this fire were demons and souls in human form, like transparent burning embers, all



blackened or burnished bronze, floating about in the conflagration, now raised into the air by the flames that issued from within themselves together with great clouds of smoke, now falling back on every side like sparks in huge fires, without weight or equilibrium, amid shrieks and groans of pain and despair, which horrified us and made us tremble with fear. (It must have been this sight which caused me to cry out, as people say they heard me.) The demons could be distinguished by their terrifying and repellent likeness to frightful and unknown animals, black and transparent like burning coals. That vision lasted only a moment, thanks to our good Mother of Heaven, Who, at the first apparition, had promised to bring us to Heaven. Without that, I think we would have died of terror and fear.

Terrified and as if to plead for succor, we looked up at Our Lady, who said to us, so kindly and so sadly:

"You have seen hell where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to My Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved and there will be peace. The war is going to end; but if people do not cease offending God, a worse one will break out during the reign of Pius XI. When you see a night illumined by an unknown light, know that this is the great sign given you by God that He is about to punish the world for its crimes by means of war, famine, and persecutions of the Church and of the Holy Father.

"To prevent this, I shall come to ask for the consecration of Russia to My Immaculate Heart, and the Communion of Reparation on the First Saturdays. If My requests are heeded, Russia will be converted and there will be peace; if not, she will spread her errors throughout the world, causing wars and persecutions of the Church. The good will be martyred, the Holy Father will have much to suffer, various nations will be annihilated. In the end, My Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to Me, and she will be converted, and a period of peace will be granted to the world. In Portugal, the dogma of the Faith will always be preserved, etc. Do not tell this to anybody. Francisco, yes, you may tell him.

"When you pray the Rosary, say after each mystery: O my Jesus, forgive us, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who are most in need."

After this, there was a moment of silence, and then I asked, "Is there anything more that You want of me?"

"No, I do not want anything more of you today."

Then, as before, Our Lady began to ascend towards the east, until She finally disappeared.

Reflection on John 14:1-12

SAINT JOHN OF AVILA

Feast Day: May 10

Patron Saint of: Andalusia, Spain

Born in the Castile region of Spain, John was sent at the age of 14 to the University of Salamanca to study law. He later moved to Alcala, where he studied philosophy and theology before his ordination as a diocesan priest.

In 1527, he traveled to Seville, hoping to become a missionary in Mexico. The archbishop of that city persuaded him to stay and spread the faith in Andalusia. During nine years of work there, he developed a reputation as an engaging preacher, a perceptive spiritual director, and a wise confessor.

Because John was not afraid to denounce vice in high places, he was investigated by the Inquisition but was cleared in 1533. He later worked in Cordoba and then in Granada, where he organized the University of Baeza, the first of several colleges run by diocesan priests who dedicated themselves to teaching and giving spiritual direction to young people.

He was friends with Saints Francis Borgia, Ignatius of Loyola, John of God, and Teresa of Avila. John of Avila worked closely with members of the Society of Jesus and helped their growth within Spain and its colonies. John's mystical writings have been translated into several languages. He was beatified in 1894, canonized in 1970, and declared a doctor of the Church on October 7, 2012.

Saint John of Avila knew that the lives of Christians can contradict the Good News of Jesus Christ, implicitly encouraging Christians to live their faith halfheartedly, and causing obstacles to non-Christians who might accept Baptism. In 16th-century Spain, those who advocated reforming the Church were often suspected of heresy. Saint John of Avila held his ground and was eventually recognized as a very reliable teacher of the Christian faith.

AROUND OUR PARISH

DEAR PARISHIONERS OF THE ST. AUGUSTINE B DEANERY (formerly the Sidney Deanery):

I pray that you and your families are experiencing the joy of the Easter Season. May Jesus, risen from the dead, fill you with hope. I am seeking your input and opinion about a Sunday evening Mass in our Deanery. For the last two years, there has been a Sunday evening Mass in the Wapakoneta-area. In March, the pastoral council of these four parishes recommended to me, their pastor, to adjust the Mass schedule so that we could have a Sunday morning Mass at all four parishes. However, the Sunday evening Mass seemed to meet a genuine need in our area. There is a Sunday evening Mass in Coldwater, but there is not another evening Mass along the I-75 corridor from St. Michael, Findlay to Immaculate Conception, Dayton. At these Masses, I noticed numerous attendees wearing apparel of the neighboring schools: Lehman, Russia, Fort Loramie, Anna, and Piqua. The Sunday evening Mass aided people in the entire area, not just our own parishioners. The priests of the deanery are discerning the possibility of having a Sunday evening Mass at a particular location and rotating the celebrant between the priests of the Deanery. Currently, there are fourteen active priests in the deanery. As we discerned this possibility, we have reached an impasse. We are curious what is actually helpful for the Catholics of the deanery. 


