## FR. ERIC'S RAMBLINGS

## Reflections on Fatima 22 of 27

August 13 continued: Our Lady appeared on the 19th at Valinhos. Because the children were in prison on August 13, 1917 they were unable to make their appointment with the beautiful Lady. "But on August 19, Our Lady appeared to them at Valinhos. The area is just a few minutes' walk from Aljustrel, on the same side as but below Loca do Cabeço. Jacinta had stayed home that day and was replaced by João, age 11, and Francisco, who looked after the flock.

Lúcia relates: "I had gone to tend the sheep with Francisco and his brother John in a place called Valinhos. Feeling that something supernatural was approaching and enveloping us, we suspected that Our Lady had come to appear to us. We felt sorry that Jacinta wasn't there to see her, so we asked her brother John to go call her. Since he didn't want to go, I offered him two coins for this, and he went running to get her."

Meanwhile, Francisco and I saw the flash of light, which we called lightning. Jacinta arrived, and a moment later, we saw Our Lady on a holm oak tree.

"What do you want of me?" "I want you to continue to go to the Cova da Iria on the thirteenth day and continue to pray the Rosary every day. In the last month I will perform a miracle so that all may believe." "What do you want done with the money the people leave in the Cova da Iria?" "Make two litters [a sort of bier or wooden framework to carry statues in procession]. You are to carry one with Jacinta and two more girls dressed in white; Francisco is to carry the other one, with three other boys. The money from the litters is for the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, and anything left over can be put toward the chapel that is to be built here."

Lúcia then asked for the cure of some sick people. Our Lady answered that some of them would be cured during the year. Then, looking very sad, she begged: "Pray, pray very much, and make sacrifices for sinners, for many souls go to hell because they have no one who will sacrifice themselves for them."

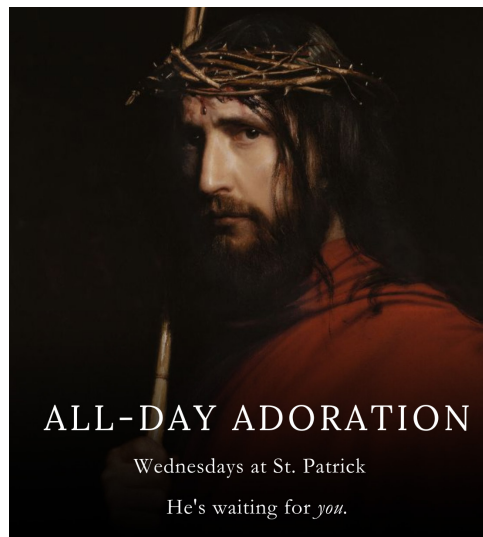

## AS YOU GO...

Reflection on Matthew 10:37-42

Today's Gospel is the conclusion of the pep talk Jesus gave the twelve before sending them on mission. It started several Sundays ago with the specific charge that they were to go to all the towns and villages of Israel proclaiming that God's kingdom was at hand. Next came instructions about how they were to make the journey – traveling light and relying on hospitality. Now, Jesus asks them to be faithful to the mission, faithful to this loving Father, who deserves a love from them that supersedes their love for anyone or anything else.

Despite the somber tone of the first few verses, both parts of this Gospel encourage the follower of Jesus. If true life is found only in Jesus, then anyone who lays aside anything for the sake of Jesus will reap a bumper crop. The sacrifices a person makes in following Jesus are more than outweighed by the benefits that come from being Jesus' friend. Jesus does not pretend that discipleship is cost-free, but He does insist that the gain is worth the loss.

## SAINT MARIA GORETTI

Feast Day: July 6

Patron Saint of: Girls, Teenagers

She was the daughter of a poor Italian tenant farmer, had no chance to go to school, never learned to read or write.

On a hot afternoon in July, Maria was sitting at the top of the stairs of her house, mending a shirt. She was not quite 12 years old, but physically mature. A cart stopped outside, and a neighbor, 18-year-old Alessandro, ran up the stairs. He seized her and pulled her into a bedroom. She struggled and tried to call for help. "No, God does not wish it," she cried out. "It is a sin. You would go to hell for it." Alessandro began striking at her blindly with a long dagger.

Maria was taken to a hospital. Her last hours were marked by the usual simple compassion of the good – concern about where her mother would sleep, forgiveness of her murderer (she had been in fear of him, but did not say anything lest she cause trouble to his family), and her devout welcoming of Viaticum, her last Holy Communion. She died about 24 hours after the attack.

Alessandro was sentenced to 30 years in prison. For a long time he was unrepentant and surly. One night he had a dream or vision of Maria gathering flowers and offering them to him. His life changed. When he was released after 27 years, his first act was to beg the forgiveness of Maria's mother.

Devotion to the young martyr grew, miracles were worked, and in less than half a century she was canonized. At her beatification in 1947, her 82-year-old mother, two sisters, and her brother appeared with Pope Pius XII on the balcony of St. Peter's. Three years later, at Maria's canonization, a 66-year-old Alessandro Serenelli knelt among the quarter-million people and cried tears of joy.

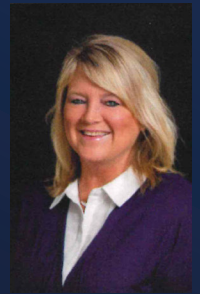

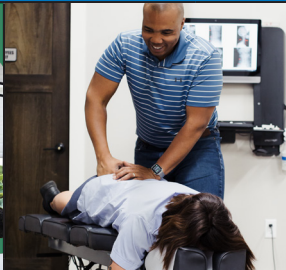
