FR. ERIC - RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 20 of 27

August 13 continued: The Solemnity of Assumption

On the morning of Wednesday, August 15, the Feast of Our Lady's Assumption, the most tragic part of this drama took place. The children were again called to the office of the administrator and tempted with the promise of beautiful gold pieces if they would reveal the secret. Threats did not shake their resolve, so the administrator threw them into prison!



Not only did the administrator bring the children to jail, putting them in the company of dangerous criminals, but he also threatened to keep them there and fry them in oil. If all this would have caused fright and anxiety to an adult, it was much worse for children between seven and ten years old, who did not understand the game in which they were victims. Despite all this, the threat of keeping them in prison was to no avail, although it must have terrified them.

Sr. Lúcia described the events this way, "After they had separated us, we were reunited in another room in the prison. They had told us that soon they would come take us to fry us alive. Jacinta then went over next to a window that overlooked the cattle market. I assumed at first that she was doing this to distract herself with the view; but before long I realized that she was crying. I went to get her to bring her next to me and asked why she was crying: 'Because,' she replied, 'we are going to die without going back to see our parents, not even our mothers!" 20 Besides the sufferings of being thrown among hostile strangers and threatened with a painful death – a threat the little shepherds took seriously – they also suffered from being separated from their families. In fact, Lúcia speaks of this in her Memoirs: "When we were imprisoned, what cost Jacinta the most was to feel abandoned by her parents. With tears running down her cheeks, she said: 'Neither your parents nor mine came to see us. We don't matter to them.' 'Don't cry,' Francisco told her. 'Let's offer this to Jesus, for sinners."

Francisco kept up his spirits and tried to encourage the homesick Jacinta. But then they had to face the threat of being thrown into boiling oil. A man came in and told them to leave the room and sit on a bench outside it. Meanwhile, he gave orders to another man to prepare a cauldron. Soon after, they were told in all seriousness that the cauldron of boiling oil was ready, and that each one of them would be thrown into it if they did not reveal the secret. Then, a sullen guard appeared. His name is said to have been Cândido Alho, although this is uncertain. He told them very seriously that the cauldron was ready and called Jacinta, saying that she would be the first to be burned. She went out quickly, without saying goodbye to Francisco and Lúcia, convinced that the whole thing was in earnest.



APPRENTICE

Reflection on Matthew 9:36-10:8

A friend's son, who had a passion for building things as a child, followed that passion as a young adult into an apprenticeship to a master carpenter that lasted for several years. His Dad and I watched with fascination and pride as this young man learned the trade and became himself a master craftsman. Such a process takes time, patience, willingness to learn, openness to be stretched.

So it is with discipleship in Jesus. As Jesus sends out His twelve disciples in today's Gospel, they are very much still in apprenticeship. Even though there is an urgency to the mission, as expressed by Jesus' pity at the sight of the crowds in such need of shepherding, the disciples are instructed to go only "to the lost sheep of the house of Israel," and not yet to the Gentiles. Our onthe-job-training, even in ministry, in discipleship, usually begins in the shallow end of the pool, where we test our skills, learn how to apply them, take constructive criticism and adjust appropriately as we go.

SAINT ALOYSIUS GONZAGA

Feast Dav: June 21

Mt 6:1-6, 16-18

AT A

Patron Saint of: Catholic Youth, Teenagers, Seminarians

At age 7, Aloysius experienced a profound spiritual quickening. His prayers included the Office of Mary, the psalms, and other devotions. At age 9, he came from his hometown of Castiglione to Florence to be educated; by age 11, he was teaching catechism to poor children, fasting three days a week, and practicing great austerities. When he was 13 years old, he traveled with his parents and the Empress of Austria to Spain, and acted as a page in the court of Philip II. The more Aloysius saw of court life, the more disillusioned he became, seeking relief in learning about the lives of saints.

A book about the experience of Jesuit missionaries in India suggested to him the idea of entering the Society of Jesus, and in Spain his decision became final. Now began a four-year contest with his father. Eminent churchmen and laypeople were pressed into service to persuade Aloysius to remain in his "normal" vocation. Finally he prevailed, was allowed to renounce his right to succession, and was received into the Jesuit novitiate.

Like other seminarians, Aloysius was faced with a new kind of penance—that of accepting different ideas about the exact nature of penance. He was obliged to eat more, and to take recreation with the other students. He spent four years in the study of philosophy and had Saint Robert Bellarmine as his spiritual adviser.

In 1591, a plague struck Rome. The Jesuits opened a hospital of their own. Because he nursed patients, washing them and making their beds, Aloysius caught the disease. A fever persisted after his recovery and he was so weak he could scarcely rise from bed. Yet he maintained his great discipline of prayer, knowing that he would die three months later within the octave of Corpus Christi, at the age of 23.




