FR. ERIC'S RAMBLINGS

Reflections on Fatima 25 of 27

October 13: The Miracle of the sun.

Let's now turn our attention to October, the Miracle of the Sun and the fulfilment of the promise of "the Beautiful Lady" to tell the children who she was and what she wanted of them.

Our Lady's promise that she would perform a great miracle in October so that all would believe spread all over Portugal and aroused in people a great sense of expectation. Even those who feigned a certain indifference could not ignore the question in everyone's mind: Will something extraordinary happen? What will it be? Those with vivid imaginations tried to guess what might happen. Others used the occasion to make terrifying prophecies. The intolerant threatened the children, promising to avenge themselves in some way if it all turned out to be a deception. A wave of rumors in this atmosphere spread quickly. One of the alarming rumors circulating was that the civil authorities had actually decided to plant beside the children a bomb that would detonate at the moment of the apparition. How did the three children react to these threats?

As for Lúcia, she said she felt no fear whatsoever. She talked about it with her cousins, whose reaction was: "How wonderful, if we were granted the grace to go from here to heaven with Our Lady." Only Lúcia, Francisco, and Jacinta continued to be confident, because they were certain that the Lady clothed in light would not fail to keep her promise. She would perform a great miracle that would put an end to all doubts. Meanwhile, Lúcia's parents decided to accompany her to the Cova da Iria for the first time. "If my daughter is going to die, I want to die by her side."

António Santos brought his daughter by the hand to the place of the apparitions. The confusion at the Cova was so great, however, that they did not meet again until that night, at their home. Lúcia's mother, too, always so hesitant about her daughter's truthfulness, understood that the moment had come to summon all her maternal courage. "My mother," said Lúcia, "her heart torn with uncertainty as to what was going to happen and fearing it would be the last day of my life, wanted to accompany me."

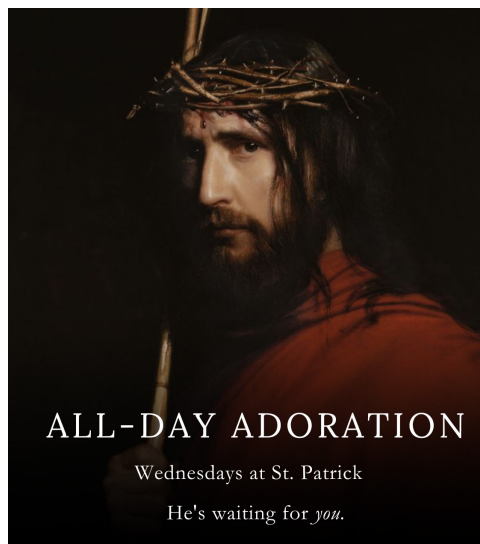

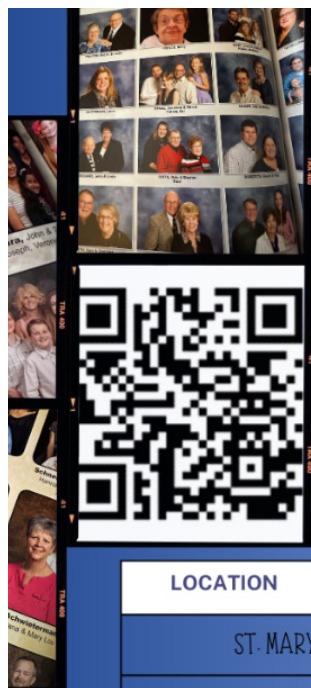

WEEDS AND WHEAT

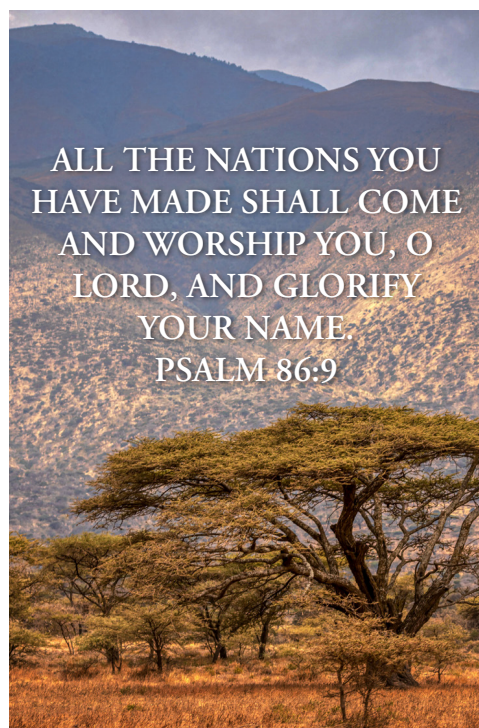
Reflection on Matthew 13:24-43

Last week, Jesus spoke of the frustrations of the sower. What with poor soil conditions, pests, weeds, and plant blight, it seems foolhardy to expect a crop. Today's parable focuses more sharply on the crop itself; the field is dotted with weeds that are crowding out the wheat, stealing its nourishment, blocking its access to the sunlight. Today's farmer would spray a herbicide, but the farmer of Jesus' day could rely only on the back-breaking method of tearing out the weeds by hand. And that, Jesus says, would do more harm than good. Better to let both grow until the harvest, when they can be sorted out more carefully.

Jesus, of course, is not giving agricultural advice, but using this image to remind us that only God can read hearts. The parable cautions us to be patient. We are not infallible in our judgments about what is wheat and what is weed.

God is the final harvester. God is the final judge, and God has not invited any of us to sit on that judgment seat with Him. The truth is, most if not all of us are a mixture of weeds and wheat. But God is faithful. God is not finished with any of us yet. God has been present throughout our growth, our struggles, our journeying with each one of us to make of us a gleaming, golden field of wheat, of goodness, justice, and kindness, a rich harvest of love for the world.

SAINT JAMES

Feast Day: July 25

Patron Saint of: Laborers

This James is the brother of John the Evangelist. The two were called by Jesus as they worked with their father in a fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee. James was one of the favored three who had the privilege of witnessing the Transfiguration, the raising to life of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony in Gethsemani.

James and John gave evidence that the nickname Jesus gave them—"sons of thunder"—was an apt one. The Samaritans would not welcome Jesus because He was on His way to hated Jerusalem. "When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?' Jesus turned and rebuked them..." (Luke 9:54-55).

James was apparently the first of the apostles to be martyred. "About that time King Herod laid hands upon some members of the church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also" (Acts 12:1-3a).

This James, sometimes called James the Greater, is not to be confused with James the Lesser or with the author of the Letter of James and the leader of the Jerusalem community.

The way the Gospels treat the apostles is a good reminder of what holiness is all about. There is very little about their virtues as static possessions, entitling them to heavenly reward. Rather, the great emphasis is on the Kingdom, on God's giving them the power to proclaim the Good News. As far as their personal lives are concerned, there is much about Jesus' purifying them of narrowness, pettiness, fickleness.

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati, in keeping with its policies, has completed the five-year revision of the Decree on Child Protection. We anticipate the revised Decree will be available for download and acknowledgment on the SafeParish website on or about July 1, 2023. Each user with a SafeParish account will need to download, acknowledge to have read, and agree to abide by the requirements of the revised Decree. If this is not completed within 30 days of the promulgation of the Decree by the Archbishop, the user's SafeParish account will show as pending until the user completes the acknowledgement. Users with pending SafeParish accounts are not permitted to work or volunteer with youth until they have met all the child protection requirements and their SafeParish account is approved. Please contact your parish or school safe environment coordinator with any questions.

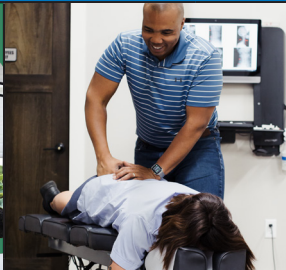
