LETTER TO THE PEOPLE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA FAMILY OF PARISHES FROM THE PRIESTS

Recently, Fr. Eric received an email from a young mother, very upset, because someone approached her after Mass and "scolded her" because her young children were noisy at Mass. This person was made to feel that she and her children are not welcome at Mass. There have been other families that have been told the same over the past couple of years. First and foremost, we, the spiritual fathers of Our Lady of Fatima parish, would like to state that we openly and warmly welcome all our families with young children and all of our families that have children with special needs. As priests celebrating Mass, we don't mind the noise, the crying, the talking or the child that "escapes" and runs around the church. We fully understand that you, as parents, are doing the best you can, but children will be children. You should never be made to feel ashamed or embarrassed because someone tells you to "stay away from church until you have your children under control." Secondly, to those individuals that are reproaching our families with young children, we are asking you to cease this immediately. It is not your place to correct, scold, or to reproach these families. When you take it upon yourself to act in this way you are no different than the apostles that tried to prevent the children from approaching Jesus. Remember Our Lord's response, "but Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven.'"

SAFEPARISH

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati, in keeping with its policies, has completed the five-year revision of the Decree on Child Protection. We anticipate the revised Decree will be available for download and acknowledgment on the SafeParish website on or about July 1, 2023. Each user with a SafeParish account will need to download, acknowledge to have read, and agree to abide by the requirements of the revised Decree. If this is not completed within 30 days of the promulgation of the Decree by the Archbishop, the user's SafeParish account will show as pending until the user completes the acknowledgement. Users with pending SafeParish accounts are not permitted to work or volunteer with youth until they have met all the child protection requirements and their SafeParish account is approved. Please contact your parish or school safe environment coordinator with any questions.

SINKING DOUBT

Reflection on Matthew 14:22-33

Peter, the “rock” upon whom Jesus will build His Church, sinks like a rock in today’s Gospel. Jesus’ outstretched hand saves Peter, in his doubt born of the strong wind, from sinking.

There seems to be a universal disenchantment today with leaders and authorities in all our institutions – government, church, business, and education – because they come wrapped in faith that sometimes falters, character that sometimes stumbles, vision that sometimes goes murky. Not only can they not walk on water, but they cannot even swim either. Of course, the same is true of all of us.

The Swiss psychiatrist, Carl Jung, had these words inscribed above the door of his office: “Called or not, God is present.” The transcendent, Almighty God, chooses to be with humankind: to commune with us, to love and move among us, to be always near, to abide with us, to be present whether called or not, in peace as well as in panic. The same grace and compassion that rescued Peter will rescue us, whether our lives are moving along swimmingly or sinking in some mire.

SAINT JOHN EUDES

Feast Day: August 8

Patron Saint of: Astronomers

John joined the religious community of the Oratorians and was ordained a priest at 24. During severe plagues in 1627 and 1631, he volunteered to care for the stricken in his own diocese.

At age 32, John became a parish missionary. His gifts as a preacher and confessor won him great popularity. He preached over 100 parish missions, some lasting from several weeks to several months.

In his concern with the spiritual improvement of the clergy, John realized that the greatest need was for seminaries. After prayer and counsel, John decided it was best to leave the religious community. That same year John founded a new community, ultimately called the Eudists—the Congregation of Jesus and Mary—devoted to the formation of the clergy by conducting diocesan seminaries.

In his parish mission work, John was disturbed by the sad condition of prostitutes who sought to escape their miserable life. Temporary shelters were found, but arrangements were not satisfactory. A certain Madeleine Lamy, who had cared for several of the women, one day said to him, “Where are you off to now? To some church, I suppose, where you’ll gaze at the images and think yourself pious. And all the time what is really wanted of you is a decent house for these poor creatures.” The words, and the laughter of those present, struck deeply within him. The result was another new religious community, called the Sisters of Charity of the Refuge. Holiness is the wholehearted openness to the love of God. It is visibly expressed in many ways, but the variety of expression has one common quality: concern for the needs of others.

ADULT FAITH FORMATION**GRIEF SHARE – NEW SESSIONS FOR 2023**


