LETTER TO THE PEOPLE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA FAMILY OF PARISHES
FROM THE PRIESTS

Recently, Fr. Eric received an email from a young mother, very upset, because someone approached her after Mass and “scolded her” because her young children were noisy at Mass. This person was made to feel that she and her children are not welcome at Mass. There have been other families who have been told the same over the past couple of years. First and foremost, we, the spiritual fathers of Our Lady of Fatima parish, would like to state that we openly and warmly welcome all our families with young children and all of our families who have children with special needs. As priests celebrating Mass, we don’t mind the noise, the crying, the talking or the child who “escapes” and runs around the church. We fully understand that you, as parents, are doing the best you can, but children will be children. You should never be made to feel ashamed or embarrassed because someone tells you to “stay away from church until you have your children under control.” Secondly, to those individuals who are reproaching our families with young children, we are asking you to cease this immediately. It is not your place to correct, scold, or to reproach these families. When you take it upon yourself to act in this way you are no different than the apostles who tried to prevent the children from approaching Jesus. Remember Our Lord’s response, “but Jesus said, ‘Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven.’”

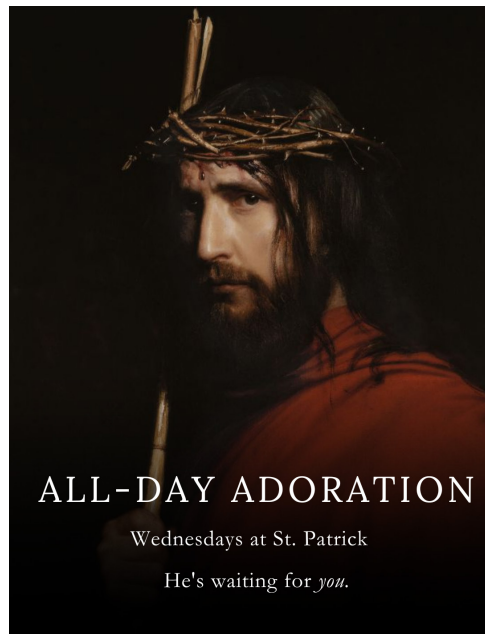
ST. PATRICK ROOF REPAIR

WHO AM I?

Reflection on Matthew 16:13-20

Today's Gospel presents us with one of the central questions of our lives as Jesus asks: "Who do you say that I am?" There are so many answers that one can give: Lord, Savior, friend, teacher, Redeemer, confidant, brother, healer, Son of the Living God, Light of the World, the Christ. At one time or another in our lives, even in the course of any given day, one of these might surface as central in our relationship with Jesus.

Let us also consider that when addressing this question of Jesus' identity, we are also answering the question, "Who am I?" What do I believe? What do I stand for? Where is the North on my compass? What do I place at the center of my life?

When Peter confesses that Jesus is the Christ in answer to the question, Jesus then renames Peter, giving him a new identity and a new purpose. The same can happen to us, if we allow it. Jesus can re-name us, re-direct our passions, give us new understanding, renew in us clean hearts and the desire to follow Him wherever He might lead.

THE PASSION OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST

Feast Day: August 29

Patron Saint of: builders and tailors

The drunken oath of a king with a shallow sense of honor, a seductive dance and the hateful heart of a queen combined to bring about the martyrdom of John the Baptist. The greatest of prophets suffered the fate of so many Old Testament prophets before him: rejection and martyrdom. The "voice crying in the desert" did not hesitate to accuse the guilty, did not hesitate to speak the truth. But why? What possesses a man that he would give up his very life?

This great religious reformer was sent by God to prepare the people for the Messiah. His vocation was one of selfless giving. The only power that he claimed was the Spirit of Yahweh. "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3:11).

Scripture tells us that many people followed John looking to him for hope, perhaps in anticipation of some great messianic power. John never allowed himself the false honor of receiving these people for his own glory. He knew his calling was one of preparation. When the time came, he led his disciples to Jesus: "The next day John was there again with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God.' The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus" (John 1:35-37).

It is John the Baptist who has pointed the way to Christ. John's life and death were a giving over of self for God and other people. His simple style of life was one of complete detachment from earthly possessions. His heart was centered on God and the call that he heard from the Spirit of God speaking to his heart. Confident of God's grace, he had the courage to speak words of condemnation, repentance, and salvation.

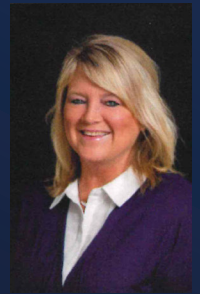
