FR. ERIC'S RAMBLINGS



THE PRAYERS OF FATIMA

The first prayer that heaven taught to the children of Fatima was the Angel of Portugal, the Angel of Peace. It has been called the Pardon Prayer, but I like to refer to this prayer as the "Great Commandment" prayer. The Great Commandment from the Gospel, the Shema prayer from Deuteronomy, is to

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your mind, with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself." This first prayer is a simple reflection of the Great Commandment. The angel had the children bow their heads to the ground and repeat, "My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love You, and I beg pardon for those that do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love You."

Our love, our hope, our faith is professed, and then our love for our neighbor inspires us to call out to God and beg pardon for those who do not have faith, hope and love.

The second prayer taught by heaven was again from the Angel of Portugal. This second prayer of Fatima is a Eucharistic prayer. The angel appeared to them and again invited them to bow their heads to the ground, as he suspended a Host in the air and chalice beneath the Host. The Host began to bleed, and drops of blood fell into the suspended chalice. The children repeated the following prayer in Adoration of the Holy Eucharist that they were about to receive. "Most Holy Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the Most Precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifferences whereby He is offended. And through the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners."

Our worship, our Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, is worship of the very heart of the Trinity, the Second Person of the Trinity, who continually humbles Himself to become the Bread of Angels. So this Eucharistic prayer begins with the simple phrase, "I adore Thee profoundly." The definition of profound is "Penetrating or entering deeply into subjects of thought or knowledge; having deep insight or understanding; originating in or penetrating to the depths of one's being." In other words, our "profound" worship of the Trinity originates with the One we are worshiping: the Holy Trinity. Synonyms for profoundly include such beautiful terms as, "extremely," "exceedingly," "greatly," "immensely," "enormously," "intensely," just to name a few. But they each call us to that profound or intense worship of our Creator. We are called to offer to the Father, His Son - Our Divine Lover - who offered His life to the Father, on the Cross for our Salvation, so that we can know the Father in Heaven and spend eternity with the very Triune God who we worship profoundly.
