THE VICAR'S VOICE

As we move closer to the vote on Issue 1, it may seem that the world threatens to break apart. We may even say, "Heaven help us!" This is a good mental habit! How do we make what we pray for more of a reality? It might help to understand that Heaven is not so much a place as it is a state of relationship with another. Knowing this, we can "make" heaven present within by becoming more ourselves. Through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, in all its plentiful and various forms we "grow" in being. By these, we enter into a way of life that enlivens our souls and molds us for victory or challenge. These acts of goodwill perhaps dispose us to one of the hardest things to remember in the daily grind. We are pilgrims on this earth.

We are not made for earth. Rather it is to exist with God for eternity. As Paul says to our brother Philippians (3:14), "My entire attention is on the finish line as I run toward the prize to which God calls me - life on high in Christ Jesus." Counterintuitively, increased commitment to our forward-looking path causes us to try harder to bring all that is heavenly into our relationship with God and others. Meditating on the fruits of eternity naturally encourages us to do things that fill us up. After experiencing what it is to be filled up with Love, Truth and Peace, we can't help but try to do the same for others. This is the life where we receive in abundance what God imparted, where we obtain heavenly graces and where we give effortlessly.

While this type of life is given by God, it is not secured. The proposition of Issue 1 is proof. We are in a battle for thirsting souls. To be of aid to our brothers and sisters in Christ we must wrestle with ourselves. St. Polycarp writes to the Philippians, "Do not look on such people as enemies, but invite them back as frail members who have gone astray so that the entire body of which you are apart will be saved." While he is talking about someone he knew who entered into a path of life inconsistent with the good, his words still impart meaning to us. All mankind is on the same team by virtue of his most inherent desire for truth and love. This is not meant in any sentimental way. The depths of this claim demand only the best from man. Just as husband and wife enter into the matrimonial mission most when they realize that doing the dishes or changing diapers is not a question of power or contractual engagement, but a way to give to the family's common good to their spousal relationship and provides a way to the cross, so too man enters into his messianic responsibility when he wills the good of the other as a friend would. If we treat enemies as friends gone astray, with how much more charity would we treat our closest friends? How much stronger would the Body of Christ be? How many souls would be won if we exampled charity even in unrequited relationships? It is unimaginably glorious. Perhaps, it is all we desire and more besides.

Under the coaching and facilitation of Catholic Leadership Institute, we are underway with Our Lady of Fatima's Pathway Plan (strategic plan). This month, the committee members have begun drafting year two of the plan which will launch in Fall 2024. We, our Churches and their people, as the Body of Christ, work toward our common mission and vision:

MISSION: Our Lady of Fatima family of parishes accompanies people in becoming disciples of Christ through community, sacraments, scripture and prayer.

VISION: Our Lady of Fatima will be one community of missionary disciples who radiate Christ in their lives and to those around them.

These programs, opportunities and unified ministries have recently begun, which satisfies goals within our Pathway Plan:

Glory Day - St. Patrick and Piqua Catholic Schools came together for a beautiful day of worship of Our Lord.

Education Programs - Classes for grades K-8 (CCD/Confirmation Prep) in addition to the program for those seeking to come fully into the faith (OCIA, formerly RCIA) are now coordinated and provided throughout OLF's region.

Junior High / HS Youth Ministry - Opportunities for students to gather for faith and fellowship activities are being held.

Bulletin – A successful coordinated reveal of our unified bulletin now provides all five churches a platform to learn what's happening within OLF.

Liturgical Ministry - More than 300 parishioners are called to volunteer in this way, and were recently trained and commissioned into their roles.

Eucharistic Adoration – Now available in three cities, West Milton (Thursday), Piqua (St. Claire Chapel hours) and Troy (Wednesday). September 13 was the first unified Pastoral Council meeting for Our Lady of Fatima, with the individual churches' councils having selected their two to three representatives to serve.

Thank you to our outgoing council members for the years of service they provided and for the year of recommendations and vision that was shared to make this transition and unification step a smooth one.

There has been wonderful collaboration and energy amongst this Our Lady of Fatima's Pastor Council team in the first two meetings. They will be a positive and open exchange between parish leadership/the pastor and the voice of our parishioners.

WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Current Ohio laws* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,** "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortionproviding physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 22

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- 3. However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.


Canadian Rockies & Glacier National Park June 30- July 6, 2024
