FR. ERIC'S RAMBLINGS



RESPECT LIFE MONTH

In 1995, Pope St. John Paul II penned the famous letter, "Evangelium Vitae," which translates as "The Gospel of Life." In 1998, the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) followed this up with their own document called, "Living the Gospel of Life." Below are two of the most

important quotes from this document to remind Catholics that we MUST live the Gospel of Life...the Gospel of Jesus Christ

"...Respect for the dignity of the human person demands a commitment to human rights across a broad spectrum: 'Both as Americans and as followers of Christ, American Catholics must be committed to the defense of life in all its stages and in every condition.'

The culture of death extends beyond our shores: famine and starvation, denial of health care and development around the world, the deadly violence of armed conflict and the scandalous arms trade that spawns such conflict. Our nation is witness to domestic violence, the spread of drugs, sexual activity which poses a threat to lives, and a reckless tampering with the world's ecological balance. Respect for human life calls us to defend life from these and other threats. It calls us as well to enhance the conditions for human living by helping to provide food, shelter and meaningful employment, beginning with those who are most in need. We live the Gospel of Life when we live in solidarity with the poor of the world, standing up for their lives and dignity. Yet abortion and euthanasia have become preeminent threats to human **dignity** because they directly attack life itself, the most fundamental human good and the condition for all others. They are committed against those who are weakest and most defenseless, those who are genuinely the poorest of the poor.'

...We believe that the Gospel of Jesus Christ is a 'Gospel of life.' It invites all persons and societies to a new life lived abundantly in respect for human dignity. We believe that this Gospel is not only a complement to American political principles, but also the cure for the spiritual sickness now infecting our society. As Scripture says, no house can stand divided against itself (Lk 11:17). We cannot simultaneously commit ourselves to human rights and progress while eliminating or marginalizing the weakest among us. Nor can we practice the Gospel of Life only as a private piety. American Catholics must live it vigorously and publicly, as a matter of national leadership and witness, or we will not live it at all."

They continue the same work in their rural community since Maryknoll Fathers & Brothers mission movement left Chile in 2010. Maruja is president of the Tremonhue Center which provides programs for women's health, is on the committee for the La Leona Center and is a member of the La Leona Weaving Co-op. Both

Ted and Maruja participate in a local agricultural co-op and are key to providing potable water for them and their neighbors. Ted works with the community irrigation organization that channels water from mountain

streams to irrigate the farms of 60 peasant farmers and also works with the local beekeepers union. They appreciate the support of the Piqua Parishes Mission Commission. A portion of proceeds from the summer Rummage Sale helps sponsor their work! Their three daughters grew up in Piqua and still live in the U.S. Ted's parents, who were founders of the Mission Committee, still live in Piqua.
