Dear Brothers in Holy Orders,

It has recently been brought to our attention again that an individual living in the area of Covington, Ohio, may be falsely presenting himself as a Roman Catholic priest affiliated with the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. This individual often goes by the names of "Father" Scott Benedict Davis and "Bishop" Scott Benedict Davis and has used social media accounts under the name of Sancti Benedicti Monasterium.

Mr. Davis is not a Roman Catholic priest or bishop in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, nor is he affiliated with the Archdiocese in any way. We have been made aware of instances where Mr. Davis solicited money and other donations under the guise of being a Catholic priest. This conduct has already been reported to the Covington, Ohio, Police Department and the Miami County Sherriff's Department. However, we wanted to make you aware of it as well, so you do not fall victim to similar behavior. Please inform any parishioners or others who may ask that Mr. Davis is in no way affiliated with the Archdiocese of Cincinnati or the Roman Catholic Church. If you learn that Mr. Davis has solicited money or other donations under false pretenses, please report the matter to local law enforcement and me.

If you have any questions regarding the above, please let me know.


