FR. ERIC'S RAMBLINGS – CHRISTMAS...BE NOT AFRAID



One of the most consoling and encouraging messages of Christmas is the angelic message, "Do not be afraid." This is a phrase that occurs 88 times in the Bible and is mostly spoken by God to His people. This phrase is repeated so often that it has been called a distillation of the whole Bible. The Lord said it to Abraham before cutting a covenant with him: "Don't be afraid." Angel Gabriel said it to Daniel when he was frightened by a terrifying vision: "Don't be afraid." The angel said it to Zechariah, future father of John the Baptist. Angel Gabriel said

it to Mary, who was troubled at the news she received. An angel said it to shepherds startled by the Christmas glory that shone round them. Jesus repeatedly said it to His disciples, culminating in His resurrected appearance when He came to His grieving, fearful friends and spoke the words: "Don't be afraid." Mary Magdalene heard this same command when she was in the garden searching for Jesus in the empty tomb. So, on this Christmas day, perhaps this command is the very one God would give to us today:

"Don't be afraid."

Since it is found all over the Bible as words spoken by God, we can trust them. All of us have fears – fears for the safety of our families, fears of our own health and life, fears about possible accidents, illnesses, violent home intrusion, fears about our jobs. We are afraid of snakes and poisonous creatures, deep water and fire hazards. We are afraid of the health of a loved one that seems to be slipping away. We are all afraid to lose what we do have. We are still afraid that what we do have, may not be enough in the end. On a global level, we are afraid of terrorist attacks, nuclear warfare, religious persecution, global warming and so many other natural disasters. Christmas reminds us that if we fear God with reverential fear prompted by love, we don't have to fear anything else in the world. We don't have to fear people and things that can only hurt us in this life. No one can take away who we are in Christ. No one can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus!

On behalf of Fr. Jim, Fr. Steve, Fr. Callan, Fr. Joe, Deacon John, Deacon Jim and all the staff and parish leaders, we want to wish you a truly Christ-filled, joy-filled and love-filled Christmas.

MUSIC & LITURGY

THE ANTIPHONS: A MISSING PUZZLE PIECE

Beginning this Advent, Mass will sound a bit different throughout our Family of Parishes. Prior to the opening hymn, the cantor or choir will sing or read an "Entrance Antiphon." You might wonder, "*What is an antiphon?*" Simply put, the antiphons are a set of musical prayers which have been assigned to each Mass, just like the readings on Sunday that are set to a predetermined schedule. Every Mass, not just those in Advent, has a set of assigned antiphons which are to be sung or read during or before the entrance and Communion processions.*

You might also wonder, "Why are the antiphons important, and why are we singing them?" Antiphons are important because they are a lens through which we can view the Scriptures more richly. The antiphons are commonly drawn from the Psalms and Old Testament, and make "comments" on the Gospel and readings of the day. They can highlight Old Testament prophecies that are brought to fruition in the life of Jesus, or comment with excitement on the events of the Gospels.

As we journey through this Advent season, I challenge you to pray with the texts of the antiphons – these "missing puzzle pieces" – at Mass. In a special way, notice the antiphon for the Third Sunday of Advent (pink), traditionally called "Gaudete Sunday." The name Gaudete, translated: *rejoice*, comes directly from the Entrance Antiphon "Gaudete in Domino…" (Rejoice in the Lord always) and reminds us the coming of the Lord is near.
