Mollie and Linda, representatives from Morgan's Place Cemetery, have been guest speakers at MORGAN'S PLACE Our Lady of Fatima Masses the month of June. Fr. Steve Shoup serves as a director on their

team, and helps grieving couples following a loss of an unborn baby.

Morgan's Place was established to assist families through the grieving process when experiencing the loss of a baby. They aid this process by memory-making, birth planning, funeral and burial services and postpartum support groups for parents.

The Verdier family dedicated two and half acres of their farmland not only for the burial of their unborn babies, Morgan and Marion, but also to assist others who suffer similar losses.

Ways that Morgan's Place serves includes: Liaison to the Funeral Home, Funeral Planning, Burial in Morgan's Place Cemetery, Grave Marker Design and Placement, Grief Support, Post-Abortion Healing, Birth Planning, Memorial Wall (providing parents a place to recognize their babies that were not able to be buried).

All services are provided at no cost to the family.


