

Class is required, by appointment. Prior to Baptizing your child, register for your required Baptism Class: pcartwright@stpattroy.org, 937-335-2833. OLF Baptism Classes are held at St. Patrick Parish Center (white building behind the school), upstairs Room 3.

MATRIMONY

Schedule at least nine months in advance. Preparation program and parish registration is required.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Those weakened by age, afflicted by serious illness or preparing for serious surgery should receive this sacrament.

HOMEBOUND

Extraordinary Ministers can be arranged to visit homes and nursing facilities with the Eucharist for those unable to worship on Sundays.

SAFEPARISH

To volunteer with children within Our Lady of Fatima, you must be Archdiocesan compliant and registered with the SafeParish program.

Mental Wellness for the Faithful

Peace be with you. In Matthew 18, St. Peter believes that seven times of forgiveness would be enough. However, as we know, Jesus responds with "...Not seven times, but seventy seven times," or infinite. However, here's a couple of questions to ponder: How many times do we hold onto grudges, hoping to never be hurt again or waiting for the other person to change their ways? Or, how often do we remind ourselves of our own failings over and over again to push ourselves to be better or to avoid making mistakes again? Yet, doing either of these often only keeps us prisoners, locked away from the freedom that Christ and His love has won for us. Try this: When someone wrongs you, say to yourself, "In the name of Jesus, I forgive (person's name) for (what they did)." Also, try this regarding yourself, too. "In the name of Jesus, I forgive (my own name) for (what I did)." The more we do this, the more we honor Jesus' instruction and avail ourselves to the freedom He yearns for us to experience. CATHOLICISM EXPLAINED

Purgatorian Mass in the Catholic Church BY: FR. STEVEN SHOUP, VICAR



Purgatorian Masses hold a unique place in the spiritual fabric of the Catholic Church, embodying the Church's unwavering commitment to the doctrine of purgatory and its profound belief in the communion of saints. These special Masses are offered for the souls of the faithful departed who are believed to be in purgatory — a transitional state where souls undergo purification before entering the fullness of God's presence in heaven. Rooted in centuries-old theological principles and liturgical tradition, Purgatorian Masses reflect the Church's understanding of God's mercy, human redemption and the power of prayerful intercession.

The concept of purgatory is one of the distinguishing features of Catholic theology. According to Catholic teaching, purgatory is neither a place of eternal punishment nor a second chance at salvation. Instead, it is viewed as a state of purifying fire where souls are cleansed of the residual effects of sin, enabling them to attain the holiness necessary to

enter heaven. The doctrine is derived from Scriptural references, such as 2 Maccabees 12:46, which states that it is a "Holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from their sins," as well as passages from the New Testament that allude to a purifying process.

The tradition of offering Masses for the souls in purgatory dates to the early Christian era. From the very beginning, Christians prayed for the deceased, as evidenced by inscriptions on ancient tombs and catacomb walls. By the Middle Ages, this practice became more formalized, evolving into the establishment of special Masses and devotions for the departed.

For many Catholics, Purgatorian Masses are a source of profound spiritual comfort. They affirm the belief that death does not sever the bonds of love and connection between the living and the departed. Through these Masses, the faithful can participate in the divine work of mercy by aiding souls in purgatory, thus demonstrating the Church's teaching on the communion of saints — that all members of the Church, living and deceased, are united in Christ.

Purgatorian Masses encapsulate the Catholic Church's enduring commitment to the doctrine of purgatory and the transformative power of prayer. They provide a sacred opportunity to intercede for souls, affirming the hope of salvation and the promise of eternal life. In celebrating these Masses, Catholics not only honor their departed loved ones but also participate in the spiritual solidarity that defines the communion of saints. As the Church continues to navigate modern challenges, Purgatorian Masses remain a timeless testament to faith, mercy, and the profound interconnectedness of all believers across the realms of life and death.

Due to the loss of Sunday Masses at Transfiguration and St. Teresa, the following Masses will soon be held for Purgatorian intentions that can be reserved, as Purgatorian Masses, to allow for multiple intentions for the deceased during one Mass time. This will begin as these dates/times clear from previously-held reservations. *Up to five names accepted.*




