FR. ERIC BOWMAN'S RAMBLINGS - FREEDOM THROUGH CHRIST



Have you ever reflected on what freedom is or its different aspects? Do you think about its value and the effort it takes to be truly "free?" Like many countries around the world, the United States celebrates its independence on a particular day. For the United States, the 4th of July is the day it commemorates the event that led to our freedom as a country. While it's good to remember and celebrate collectively as a nation, it's worth going beyond just having a barbecue and fireworks to mark such an important event. Without taking time to pause and reflect, our celebrations can lead to a vague and superficial appreciation of the day's meaning and the concrete ways in which events like this affect our daily lives. That's why it's necessary to reflect intentionally on the effort and sacrifice that make our independence and freedom possible. In the case of what led to the independence of this, or any country, it would be

good to meditate on the magnitude of the cost that brought our freedom about. For example, it would be worth meditating on the lives and blood that were shed to make independence viable, to enjoy this kind of freedom. The same can be said regarding the freedom we enjoy as Christians.

The Catholic Church believes that freedom is a gift from God, particularly through Jesus Christ. In our faith, freedom in Christ is understood as a liberation from sin and death – a gift of grace through Jesus' sacrifice and Resurrection. It's not merely the freedom to choose anything, but the freedom to choose what is good and true, guided by God's grace and the Holy Spirit. This freedom is lived out through obedience to God's Will and is ultimately perfected in Heaven. This freedom is not a natural human ability, but a supernatural grace bestowed upon us through faith and the Sacraments. Christ's sacrifice on the cross is the source of our liberation from sin and its consequences, including death. Through Baptism and the other Sacraments, we participate in Christ's death and Resurrection, receiving grace to overcome the power of sin. True freedom in Christ is connected to the truth, especially the truth of God's revelation in Jesus. It's about knowing and living according to God's Will, which is the path to true happiness and fulfillment. Freedom in Christ involves a willing obedience to His Will, even when it is difficult or counterintuitive. This obedience is not a restriction of freedom, but a source of true liberation and joy. Humility is also essential, as it allows us to recognize our dependence on God and to humbly seek His guidance. True freedom is not fully realized in this life, but will be fully experienced in Heaven, where we will be in perfect communion with God and free from the limitations of sin and death.
